# A Good Witness (Philippians 2:12-30)

## Let Your Light Shine

"Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, **work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure. Do all things without complaining and disputing**, that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, **among whom you shine as lights in the world**, holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain. Yes, and if I am being poured out as a drink offering on the **sacrifice and service of your faith**, I am glad and rejoice with you all. For the same reason you also be glad and rejoice with me." Philippians 2:12-18 NKJV

#### Philippians 2:12-18

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure." Philippians 2:12-13 NKJV

## Me who endures to the end...shall be saved?

- "And because lawlessness will abound, the love of many will grow cold. But he who endures to the end shall be saved [Strong's Greek 4982]. And this gospel of the kingdom will be preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, and then the end will come." Matthew 24:12-14 NKJV
  - Will be Saved: (Verb) (<u>sōthēsetai</u>) Strong's Greek
     4982: To save, heal, preserve, rescue. From a
     primary sos; to save, i.e. Deliver or protect.
- If salvation is free, how can you possibly work it out?
- <u>"...work out your own salvation [Strong's Greek 4991]</u>
   with fear and trembling; ..." Philippians 2:12-13 NKJV
  - Salvation: (Noun) (sōtērian) Strong's Greek 4991:
     Feminine of a derivative of soter as noun; rescue or safety.

- "Will be Saved" and "Salvation" both come from the same root:
  - sózó: to save: 4982 sốzō (from sōs, "safe, rescued")
     properly, deliver out of danger and into safety;
     used principally of God rescuing believers from the
     penalty and power of sin and into His provisions
     (safety).
  - [4982 (sốzō) is the root of: 4990 /sōtếr ("Savior"),
     4991 /sōtēría ("salvation") and the adjectival form,
     4992 /sōtếrion (what is "saved/rescued from
     destruction and brought into divine safety").]
- <u>Contrast "salvation" with "redemption" (redemption, not</u> <u>salvation is actually what you are referring to when you</u> <u>talk about eternal life.</u>
  - "In Him we have <u>redemption</u> [Strong's Greek 629]
     through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to
     the riches of His grace" Ephesians 1:7 NKJV
  - Redemption: (apolytrōsin) Strong's Greek 629: From a compound of apo and lutron; ransom in full, literally, "buying back from, re-purchasing (winning back) what was previously forfeited (lost)."

- This is vitally important as you read the Word, so you don't get confused by scriptures that say, " But he who endures to the end shall be saved " and work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." These verses, and so many others like them, are not speaking of eternal life, but life here on earth. And they serve as inspiration to obey the Lord after we are redeemed (paid for once and for all), so we will enjoy an absolutely glorious life RIGHT NOW (no matter what joys we experience or suffering we endure!) And what a witness this is to the dying world. As a matter of fact, it is the most powerful witness there is.
- "Let your life witness to your faith as a follower of Christ; and only if necessary use words!"
- "Do all things without complaining and disputing,"
   Philippians 2:14 NKJV
  - **Why should a living man complain?** 
    - "Is it not from the mouth of the Most High That woe and well-being proceed? Why should a living man complain, A man for the punishment of his sins? Let us search out and examine our ways, And turn back to the LORD;"

Lamentations 3:38-40 NKJV [Written by the Prophet Jeremiah]

## <u>Even after the ocean parts and your enemies are</u> <u>swallowed!</u>

So Moses brought Israel from the Red Sea; then they went out into the Wilderness of Shur. And they went three days in the wilderness and found no water. Now when they came to Marah, they could not drink the waters of Marah, for they were bitter. Therefore the name of it was called Marah. And the people complained against Moses, saying, "What shall we drink?"" Exodus 15:22-24 NKJV

#### I'd rather stay a slave for some meat!

"Then the whole congregation of the children of Israel complained against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness. And the children of Israel said to them, "Oh, that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the pots of meat and when we ate bread to the full! For you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger." Then the LORD said to Moses, "Behold, I will rain bread from heaven for you. And the people shall go out and gather a certain quota every day, that I may test them, whether

they will walk in My law or not. And it shall be on the sixth day that they shall prepare what they bring in, and it shall be twice as much as they gather daily." Then Moses and Aaron said to all the children of Israel, "At evening you shall know that the LORD has brought you out of the land of Egypt. And in the morning you shall see the glory of the LORD; for He hears your complaints against the LORD. But what are we, that you complain against us?"" Exodus 16:2-7 NKJV

#### Mon't "tempt" God with your complaining!

"Therefore the people contended with Moses, and said, "Give us water, that we may drink." So Moses said to them, "Why do you contend with me? Why do you tempt the LORD?" And the people thirsted there for water, and the people complained against Moses, and said, "Why is it you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our livestock with thirst?"" Exodus 17:2-3 NKJV

## I'd rather live in Egypt as a slave!

"Now when the people complained, it displeased the LORD; for the LORD heard it, and His anger was aroused. So the fire of the LORD burned among them,

and consumed some in the outskirts of the camp." Numbers 11:1 NKJV

## <u>Let's go back to Egypt than enter the Promised Land</u>

"So all the congregation lifted up their voices and cried, and the people wept that night. And all the children of Israel complained against Moses and Aaron, and the whole congregation said to them, "If only we had died in the land of Egypt! Or if only we had died in this wilderness! Why has the LORD brought us to this land to fall by the sword, that our wives and children should become victims? Would it not be better for us to return to Egypt?" So they said to one another, "Let us select a leader and return to Egypt."" Numbers 14:1-4 NKJV

## **A Bad Report From the Spies-be careful what you ask for!**

"And the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron, saying,
 "How long shall I bear with this evil congregation who complain against Me? I have heard the complaints which the children of Israel make against Me. Say to them, 'As I live,' says the LORD, 'just as you have spoken in My hearing, so I will do to you: The carcasses of you who have complained against Me shall fall in this wilderness, all of you who were numbered, according to

your entire number, from twenty years old and above." Numbers 14:26-29 NKJV

## After Korah's Rebellion

"On the next day all the congregation of the children of
 Israel complained against Moses and Aaron, saying, "You
 have killed the people of the LORD."" Numbers 16:41
 NKJV

## Iust Stop it ALREADY

- "And the people spoke against God and against Moses:
  "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and our soul loathes this worthless bread." So the LORD sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people; and many of the people of Israel died." Numbers 21:5-6 NKJV
- "that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world," Philippians 2:15 NKJV

## <u>Let your light shine!</u>

"You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it

under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. **Let your light so shine** before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16 NKJV

## The Glory of the Lord IN YOU!

"Arise, shine; For your light has come! And the glory of the LORD is risen upon you. For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth, And deep darkness the people; But the LORD will arise over you, And His glory will be seen upon you. The Gentiles shall come to your light, And kings to the brightness of your rising. "Lift up your eyes all around, and see: They all gather together, they come to you; Your sons shall come from afar, And your daughters shall be nursed at your side. - "Yes, and if I am being poured out as a drink offering on the sacrifice and service of your faith, I am glad and rejoice with you all." Philippians 2:17 NKJV
  - <u>The Drink Offering (an offering added to a previous</u> sacrifice like we are added to the sacrifice of Christ)
    - "For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand." II Timothy 4:6
       NKJV
    - "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service."
       Romans 12:1 NKJV

#### **Mathebra Structure The First Drink Offering**

 "Then God appeared to Jacob again, when he came from Padan Aram, and blessed him. And God said to him,
 "Your name is Jacob; your name shall not be called Jacob anymore, but Israel shall be your name." [\*Note in Genesis 32:22-32 Jacob wrestles for a blessings and is renamed Israel] So He called his name Israel. Also God said to him: "I am God Almighty. Be fruitful and multiply; a nation and a company of nations shall proceed from you, and kings shall come from your body. The land which I gave Abraham and Isaac I give to you; and to your descendants after you I give this land." Then God went up from him in the place where He talked with him. **So Jacob set up a pillar in the place where He talked with him, a pillar of stone; and he poured a drink offering on it**, and he poured oil on it. And Jacob called the name of the place where God spoke with him, Bethel." Genesis 35:9-15 NKJV

- \*"And He said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel; for you have struggled with God and with men, and have prevailed."" Genesis 32:28 NKJV
- Drink offerings were also included with burnt and grain offerings in God-ordained sacrifices (meaning it was ADDED to the sacrifice!)
  - With the one lamb shall be one-tenth of an ephah of flour mixed with one-fourth of a hin of pressed oil, and one-fourth of a hin of wine as a drink offering." Exodus 29:40 NKJV
  - ""Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: 'When you have come into the land you are to inhabit, which I am giving to you, and you make an offering by fire to the LORD, a burnt offering or a sacrifice, to fulfill a vow or as a freewill offering or in your appointed feasts, to

make a sweet aroma to the LORD, from the herd or the flock, then he who presents his offering to the LORD shall bring a grain offering of one-tenth of an ephah of fine flour mixed with one-fourth of a hin of oil; and one-fourth of a hin of wine **as a drink offering** you shall prepare with the burnt offering or the sacrifice, for each lamb." Numbers 15:2-5 NKJV

#### **Proven Character**

"But I trust in the Lord Jesus to send **Timothy** to you shortly, that I also may be encouraged when I know your state. For I have no one like-minded, who will sincerely care for your state. **For all seek their own, not the things which are of Christ Jesus.** But you know his **proven character**, **that as a son with his father** he served with me in the gospel. Therefore I hope to send him at once, as soon as I see how it goes with me. But I trust in the Lord that I myself shall also come shortly." Philippians 2:19-24 NKJV

#### **Character is proven through suffering**

"Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope. Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us." Romans 5:1-5 NKJV

## **Mathebra Character of Timothy**

- Timothy's name appears as the co-author on 2
   Corinthians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2
   Thessalonians, and Philemon. Paul wrote to the
   Philippians about Timothy, "I have no one like
   him" (Philippians 2:19–23).
- Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, by the commandment of God our Savior and the Lord Jesus Christ, our hope, To

**Timothy, a true son in the faith:** Grace, mercy, and peace from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord." I Timothy 1:1-2 NKJV

- "This charge I commit to you, son Timothy, according to the prophecies previously made concerning you, that by them you may wage the good warfare, having faith and a good conscience, which some having rejected, concerning the faith have suffered shipwreck, of whom are Hymenaeus and Alexander, whom I delivered to Satan that they may learn not to blaspheme." I Timothy 1:18-20 NKJV
- "If you instruct the brethren in these things, you will be a good minister of Jesus Christ, nourished in the words of faith and of the good doctrine which you have carefully followed." I Timothy 4:6 NKJV
- "Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity." I Timothy 4:12 NKJV

profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work." II Timothy 3:14-17 NKJV

#### **Qualifications of an Overseer**

"This is a faithful saying: If a man desires the position of a bishop, he desires a good work. A bishop then must be blameless, the husband of one wife, temperate, soberminded, of good behavior, hospitable, able to teach; not given to wine, not violent, not greedy for money, but gentle, not quarrelsome, not covetous; one who rules his own house well, having his children in submission with all reverence (for if a man does not know how to rule his own house, how will he take care of the church of God?); not a novice, lest being puffed up with pride he fall into the same condemnation as the devil. Moreover he must have a good testimony among those who are outside, lest he fall into reproach and the snare of the devil." I Timothy 3:1-7 NKJV

#### **Qualifications of a Deacon**

 "Likewise deacons must be reverent, not doubletongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, holding the mystery of the faith with a pure conscience. But let these also first be tested; then let them serve as deacons, being found blameless. Likewise, their wives must be reverent, not slanderers, temperate, faithful in all things. Let deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. For those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a good standing and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus." I Timothy 3:8-13 NKJV

#### Not My Life—The Trait of a Man to Hold in High Esteem

"Yet I considered it necessary to send to you **Epaphroditus**, my brother, fellow worker, and fellow soldier, but your messenger and the one who ministered to my need; since he was longing for you all, and was distressed because you had heard that he was sick. **For indeed he was sick almost unto death; but God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also, lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow.** Therefore I sent him the more eagerly, that when you see him again you may rejoice, and I may be less sorrowful. **Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness, and hold such men in esteem; because for the work of Christ he came close to death, not regarding his life,** to supply what was lacking in your service toward me." Philippians 2:25-30 NKJV

#### Philippians 2:25-30

*"For indeed he [Epaphroditus] was sick almost unto death; but* God had mercy on him, and not only on him but on me also,
 *lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow."* Philippians 2:27
 NKJV *"Receive him therefore in the Lord with all gladness,* and hold such men in esteem; because for the work of Christ
 he came close to death, not regarding his life, to supply what
 was lacking in your service toward me." Philippians 2:29-30
