 - Discuss and define Faith and the seven steps process to discipleship!

 - ✓ Virtue—always the first thing that follows faith and must precede all others, or your coordinates will ALWAYS be off target!
 - Knowledge—is what you need to know in order to act wisely!
 - ☑ Self-control—don't follow your first impulses and desires!
 - Perseverance—doing what is right no matter how hard or how long it takes!

 - ☑ Brotherly Kindness—It's simple, but not easy...prefer others!
 - ✓ Love—God is love, plain and simple!

- "For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." II Peter 1:8 NKJV
 - Why is it important to know that everything is built on the free gift of faith!
 - Why is it critical that the seven steps are presented in a precise order and that they should be applied in the precise order?
 - ☑ Discuss the progression from one step to the other.
 - What does it mean to be barren or unfruitful?
 - ☑ What does it mean to know the Lord?

 - What does it mean to forget you were cleansed from your old sins?
 - ☑ Is this something you do in your faith walk?

✓ What does it mean to make your election sure?
