Title:

INDOMITABLE GRACE

- Wholistic Grace
- Grace Stewardship

In some circles in the Christian faith it is believed that God's grace is irresistible. What does that even mean? I think it best we consider the idea of grace first, before we decide if it is so overwhelming, overpowering, and compelling, as to be involuntarily unavoidable. I like to think of grace as the brilliance that might reflect off the perfect diamond, if you were to shine the brightest light imaginable in its direction. Yes, that's a great word picture, especially if you are the diamond. In spiritual vernacular, grace is God's supernatural power. God directs His power towards us in all its indomitable magnificence, and it has no choice but to reflect.

And that inspires a second question. Do we have a choice to encounter grace? I'm not thinking about the reflecting back part; that's should be self-evident. If the brightest of lights is blasted toward an object, it will illuminate that object as the light reflects from it. I'm thinking, instead, of the diamond. How perfect is the diamond, how polished? Sure light will reflect off a lump of coal if it's in the path of that light, but it won't be brilliant. And the question remains; can the diamond (or coal) run and hide, or is the brilliance unavoidable...inescapable? I'll leave that for you to ponder, as my true concern for now is you, the diamond itself, the object doing the reflecting, assuming it has encountered God's grace. And let's make a clear distinction, as there are some who believe God's grace excuses abhorrent behavior. That is like hijacking God's power in some slimy back alley transaction. Note to self: it won't work!

So, let's presume you have encountered God's grace; His supernatural power. What then? To me, it's as if you've been handed the codes to a nuclear weapon. But, in this case, it's not a weapon; it's a blessing. Or, maybe it's a weapon and a blessing. The point is —what are you going to do with it? You've been cut and polished to reflect God's grace, or have you? And if so; what will you do with it? That is the real question; what are you going to do with God's indomitable grace?

"Behold, I set before you today a **blessing and a curse**: **the blessing, if you obey** the commandments of the Lord your God which I command you today; and **the curse, if you do not obey** the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known. Now it shall be, when the Lord your God has brought you into the land which you go to possess, **that you shall put the blessing on** Mount Gerizim **and the curse on** Mount Ebal."

Deuteronomy 11:26-29 NKJV

Deuteronomy 11

2. We start off with yet another reminder that Yahweh's blessings will follow adherence to His commandments and curses will follow disobedience. Each time you see phrases like, "the commandments of Yahweh your God which I command you today," do remember that 'today' is referring to Deuteronomy as the second telling of God's laws as a whole.

- 3. This is important as to not get confused throughout the book when Moses alternates by referring to plural commandments and singular commandment. In all cases he is referring to the entire law. As an example:
 - (a) "And you will again obey the voice of the LORD and do all
 His commandments which I command you today."
 (Deuteronomy 30:8) AND...
 - (b) "For this commandment which I command you today is not too mysterious for you, nor is it far off." (Deuteronomy 30:11)

Deuteronomy 12

4. A Prescribed Place of Worship and Some Key Reminders:

- (a) Utterly destroy all pagan worship centers, instruments, monuments, images, and even the names of their Gods.
- (b) Do seek a place that Yahweh chooses.
- (c) Run from every man doing whatever is right in his own eyes.
- (d) When you cross over and dwell in safety, Yahweh will choose a place to make His name abide.
- (e) Don't just sacrifice any place you want, but only in the place Yahweh chooses.
- (f) You may slaughter and eat meat (for food) any place you wish, even those who are unlearn may eat. Only you shall not eat the blood; you shall pour it on the earth like water.

- (g) Don't, however, eat within your gates the tithe. Instead eat it before the LORD your God in the place which the LORD your God chooses.
- (h) Exception: If the place where the LORD your God chooses to put His name is too far, you may eat within your gates. But not eating the blood still applies!
- 5. Beware of False Gods: When you go in and take the promised land, and you defeat the pagan nations, don't develop any interest in anything about their gods or their worship practices. It will lead you down a dark path that will not end well. Trust me, everything they do is an abomination. "Whatever I command you, be careful to observe it; you shall not add to it nor take away from it." Deuteronomy 12:32 [See Your Final Testimony about not adding or taking away from God's Word!)
- 6. **Punishment for Apostates:** Here's the bottom line; anyone who entices you to go after other gods and serve them shall be utterly destroyed. Those who shall be obliterated include: false prophets; family members; and anyone from your cities, who were themselves enticed by pagan worshipers, and in turn attempt to entice you.
 - (a) In the case of the latter, you must also utterly destroy the city and everything in it!

Deuteronomy 14

- 7. **Improper Mourning:** Don't cut yourself or shave your heads in strange ways like the pagans do when they are mourning the loss of a loved one.
- 8. **Clean and Unclean Meat:** Moses reiterates his message from Leviticus 11 about what is permitted to be eaten from the land, the sea and the air. You can read all the details in Deuteronomy 14:3-21. Note Deuteronomy 14:21: *"You shall not boil a young goat in its mother's milk."* This is the verse that Rabbinic Judaism interprets to prohibit eating milk products and meat in the same meal. They do this to insure they do not consume the milk from the mother of the animal they are eating.
 - (a) From the land, the animal must have the hoof split into two parts, and must chew the cud in order to be clean as food. Of course, some animals have neither, and there are some that have one or the other. To be clear, the animal must have **both** to be considered food. This has never changed. See the Jerusalem Counsel Ruling in Acts 15:1-29 if you are uncertain about this fact. And of you think Peter's vision in Acts 10:9-16 changes these laws, think again. The vision was about men, not food.

- God told Peter, "And a voice spoke to him again the second time, "What God has cleansed you must not call common."" Acts 10:15 NKJV
- 2) And to leave nothing to your imagination, Peter interprets the vision for us: *"Then he said to them, "You know how unlawful it is for a Jewish man to keep company with or go to one of another nation.* **But God has shown me that I** *should not call any <u>man</u> common or unclean." Acts* 10:28 *NKJV*
- 3) Peter tells his testimony about this vision and revelation again in Acts 11:1-18. In Acts 11:9 he quotes God's exact words in Acts 10:15. *"What God has cleansed you must not call common."* And the entire context of Acts 11:1-18 is clearly demonstrating that what God was teaching Peter (and us) is to never call people unclean who He has called clean. He was calling Peter to preach to the gentiles! *"If therefore God gave them [the Gentiles] the same gift as He gave us when we believed on the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could withstand God?"* (*Acts 11:17 NKJV*) His *"blanket-coming-down-vision" was about people was not* food and who was Peter to deny his calling to the Gentiles, despite his religious predisposition to call them unclean!
- 9. Tithing Principles:

- (a) Tithe your increase of everything so you may learn to fear Yahweh always.
- (b) Eat it before Yahweh in the place where He chooses to make His name abide.
- (c) But, if the journey is too long, then exchange your increase for money, and take the money to the place God chooses.Spend that money for whatever your heart desires. Then, eat it there as you rejoice.
- (d) At the end of every third year you shall bring out the tithe of your produce of that year and store it up within your gates.Use it to feed the Levites, the stranger, the fatherless, and the widow who are within your gates. Yahweh will bless you in all the work of your hand if you do.

Deuteronomy 15

10. Debts Canceled Every Seven Years:

- (a) At the end of every seven years you shall grant a release of debts of fellow Israelites (natural and grafted), but from a foreigner you may require it.
- (b) Give up all claims except when there are no poor among you. (And there will always be poor among you... Deuteronomy 15:11)
- (c) *"For the LORD your God will bless you just as He promised you; you shall lend to many nations, but you shall not*

borrow; you shall reign over many nations, but they shall not reign over you." Deuteronomy 15:6 NKJV

11. Generosity to the Poor:

- (a) Open your hand wide to the poor and willingly lend to him what is sufficient for his need.
- (b) Do not let the proximity of their need to the year of release influence your lending. That would be evil!
- (c) For the poor will never cease from the land; therefore I command you, saying, 'You shall open your hand wide to your brother, to your poor and your needy, in your land.'" Deuteronomy 15:11 NKJV

*"For you have the poor with you always, and whenever you wish you may do them good; but Me you do not have always." Mark 14:7 NKJV

12. **The Law Concerning Bondservants:** Your Hebrew servant is released in the seventh and you are to send them away with abundant livestock, grain, and wine. The reason is because you are so blessed and you must pass it on, plus you were so prosperous because of him. If he wants to stay because he loves you and prospers with you, he can do so, but it is a one time forever decision. 13. **The Law Concerning Firstborn Animals:** Separate the firstborn of your flock and don't work it or sheer it, and eat it before the LORD each year in the place the LORD chooses. If it has a defect, you can still eat it, but you cannot offer it to Yahweh. Of course, do not eat its blood.

Deuteronomy 16

- 14. The portion ends in chapter 16:1-17 with a review of the Passover, the Feast of Weeks, and the Feast of Tabernacles. These are the pilgrimage feasts in which you are to go to Jerusalem. This way you can celebrate in the place where the LORD chooses to make His name abide.
 - (a) "Three times a year all your males shall appear before the LORD your God in the place which He chooses: at the Feast of Unleavened Bread, at the Feast of Weeks, and at the Feast of Tabernacles; and they shall not appear before the LORD empty-handed. Every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the LORD your God which He has given you." Deuteronomy 16:16-17 NKJV
- 15. To see last year's teaching on this portion: Easy Entanglements

WHOLISTIC GRACE

1. The exceeding greatness of God's power!

A. <u>Definitions</u>

- (1) The Triune Man
 - (a) Spirit, Soul and Body
 - Spirit: that which animates life. You are born with the spirit of man and you gain access to the Spirit of God when you are born-again.
 - a) "Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.'" John 3:5-7 NKJV
 - b) "For what man knows the things of a man except the **spirit of the man** which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except **the Spirit of God.** Now we have received, **not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God,** that we might know the things that have been freely given to us by God." I Corinthians 2:11-12 NKJV

- 2. Soul: your mind, will, emotions, intentions, inspirations, motivations and desires. You will become what dominates your thoughts!
 - a) "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he..." Proverbs23:7 NKJV
 - b) "Delight yourself also in the Lord, And He shall give you the **desires of your heart**." Psalms 37:4 NKJV
 - c) "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of **the thoughts and intents of the heart.**" Hebrews 4:12 NKJV
- 3. Body: the physical vehicle that houses your spirit and soul.
 - a) "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone defiles the temple of God, God will destroy him.
 For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are." I Corinthians 3:16-17 NKJV
 - b) "Flee sexual immorality [desires, intentions]. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his

own body. Or do you not know that your **body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you**, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's." I Corinthians 6:18-20 NKJV

- (2) Wholistic Grace
 - (a) Energizing Spirit, Soul and Body
 - "and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places," Ephesians 1:19-20 NKJV
 - a) The power of God becomes available to you as a Christian. The magnitude of that power would be unimaginable had God not made it perfectly clear as His intention. You can access the power that raised Christ from the grave.
- (3) Wholistic Gospel
 - (a) Sanctifying Spirit, Soul and Body
 - 1. "Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may **your whole spirit, soul, and**

body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ." I Thessalonians 5:23 NKJV

- a) The end game is clear. Your life, through the sanctification process, is to yield a purified Spirit, soul and body.
- (b) The power we have access to should produce Godliness!
 - "as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue," II Peter 1:3 NKJV
 - a) Godliness is simply wholistic integrity. When your *"your whole spirit, soul, and body becomes blameless,"* or in other words, when your triune being is in complete alignment with God's will!
- (c) This understanding about the divine power you have access to can only come about by divine revelation.
 - "do not cease to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers: that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling,

what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints,"Ephesians 1:16-18 NKJV

- a) Even my words on this page are mere words that will only filter through your eyes, briefly introduce themselves to your mind, and then soon dissipate into the ethers! This is unless they become inspired by divine revelation.
- b) Pray for a true revelation of the power you have at your disposal, and furthermore, what you will do with it!

B. <u>Obedience Unleashes God's Power</u>

- (1) Put your blessing or your curse on...
 - (a) Obey God in every way, and this is what will be available to you!
 - 1. ""Behold, I set before you today a blessing and a curse: the blessing, if you obey the commandments of the Lord your God which I command you today; and the curse, if you do not obey the commandments of the Lord your God, but turn aside from the way which I command you today, to go after other gods which you have not known. Now it shall be, when the Lord your God has brought you into the land which you go to possess, that you shall put the

blessing on Mount Gerizim **and the curse on** Mount Ebal." Deuteronomy 11:26-29 NKJV

- a) This might seem formulaic. But it is much more than this. This is a combination of God's promises partnered with human obedience.
- b) The irony, however, is that humans cannot obey God absent His grace.
- c) And, we might say that those, who came before Christ, did not have unlimited access to God's power, hence the consistent failure to obey and the definite need of a "redeemer!"
- d) What excuse then does the Christian have, who
 has unlimited access to God's grace, to disobey?
 He commands us to obey, and then empowers us
 to obey. Then we either obey or not!
- (b) The above mandate in Deuteronomy seems to demonstrate how God fulfills his ultimate promise to Abraham!
 - "I will bless those who bless you, And I will curse him who curses you; And in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed."" Genesis 12:3 NKJV
- (2) Get ready to unleash...when your obedience is complete

- (a) "and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled." II Corinthians 10:6 NKJV
 - 1. "Now I, Paul, myself am pleading with you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ—who in presence am lowly among you, but being absent am bold toward you. But I beg you that when I am present I may not be bold with that confidence by which I intend to be bold against some, who think of us as if we walked according to the flesh. For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, **bringing** every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled." II Corinthians 10:1-6 NKJV
 - a) The spiritual practice of taking every thought captive, and bringing it into submission to Christ, is how you create an obedient life!

- b) It is when you are living a life of radical, graceempowered, faith-based obedience that you will be prepared to command blessings and curses!
- c) What an awesome and frightening responsibility!
- (3) You will receive power...
 - (a) It is not a matter of if, but rather when you will recognize its availability, and what you will do with the power you have access to!
 - "Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you." Luke 10:19 NKJV
 - 2. "Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" And He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. **But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you;** and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."" Acts 1:6-8 NKJV
 - (b) Again—get this revelation. You have access to the power that raised Christ from the grave!

1. "Therefore I also, after I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all the saints, do not cease to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers: that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places, far above all principality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all." Ephesians 1:15-23 NKJV

C. The Daunting Commission

- We are commissioned to preach the Kingdom (see: <u>The</u> <u>Great Paradox</u>). This cannot be done with human strength. We must be animated by the power of God.
 - (a) John was about to transition from the main event to the opening act! He was pointing toward Christ when he was pointing at the Kingdom within! (Christ was the fullness of God manifesting in human form.) John was saying, "Look at Him!" *"He must increase, but I must decrease."* (John 3:30)
 - "In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"" Matthew 3:1-2 NKJV
 - (b) After Christ emerged from the wilderness...Christ was pointing at Himself when He was pointing at the Kingdom within! (Christ was the fullness of God manifesting in human form.) He was saying, "Look at Me!" "I have increased, John has decreased."
 - "From that time Jesus began to preach and to say,
 "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."" Matthew 4:17 NKJV

- (c) Preach the Kingdom (Y'shua sent out the 12 disciples).What follows this supernatural message is supernatural sings.
 - "And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give. Matthew 10:7-8 NKJV
 - a) What is the Kingdom of Heaven, the Gospel of the Kingdom, the Kingdom of God...?
- (d) The kingdom is within you...
 - 1. "Now when He was asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would come, He answered them and said, "The kingdom of God does not come with observation; nor will they say, 'See here!' or 'See there!' For indeed, the kingdom of God is within you."" Luke 17:20-21 NKJV
 - a) The Kingdom is at hand when the fullness of God is manifesting in a human.
 - b) Think Jesus! Jesus was the perfect manifestation of God in man.
 - c) And how was that perfection achieved? He was sinless and remained sinless unto death.

- d) And what does it mean to be sinless? It means to be perfectly obedient to God's laws, because sin is lawlessness (I John 3:4).
- e) So, what does it look like when man is sinless?
- f) It looks like radical grace-empowered, faith-based obedience to God. It looks like Christ!
- g) How is that possible for you?
- (2) Blood and Light
 - (a) The life of the creature is in the blood.
 - "Only be sure that you do not eat the blood, for the blood is the life; you may not eat the life with the meat." Deuteronomy 12:23 NKJV
 - 2. "For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul.' Therefore I said to the children of Israel, 'No one among you shall eat blood, nor shall any stranger who dwells among you eat blood.'" Leviticus 17:11-12 NKJV
 - a) It is clear that for the flesh and blood body, thatGod intended for the blood to represent its life!
 - (b) But Jesus showed us something deeper about life!

- "Then Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life."" John 8:12 NKJV
 - a) Jesus shed his blood because He was more concerned with being filled with light!
- (c) The life of the creature is in the light...we were given a preview of what that looks like!
 - "and He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light." Matthew 17:2 NKJV
 - a) The Transfiguration: Peter, James and John got a sneak peek at what a human looks like when light replaces blood!
- (d) New creature—Light replaces blood?
 - "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." II Corinthians 5:17 NKJV
- (e) He is the light of the world; You are the light of the world! Let you light (transfigured self) shine!
 - 1. **""You are the light of the world.** A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives

light to all who are in the house. **Let your light so shine before men**, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16 NKJV

- (f) What will you look like?
 - 1. "Now the Lord is the Spirit; and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord." II Corinthians 3:17-18 NKJV
 - a) It will look like Christ staring back at you when you look in the mirror!
- (3) Reminder!
 - (a) You cannot fail in His eyes!
 - "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written: "For Your sake we are killed all day long; We are accounted as sheep for the slaughter." Yet in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor

things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, **nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.**" Romans 8:35-39 NKJV

a) Nothing you do can separate you from God's plan.
 You have a job to do! Reflect God's light, His power, His grace!

Summary: WHOLISTIC GRACE

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 - (a) Spirit, Soul and Body

C. <u>The Daunting Commission</u>

- We are commissioned to preach the Kingdom (see: <u>The</u> <u>Great Paradox</u>). This cannot be done with human strength. We must be animated by the power of God.
 - (a) John was about to transition from the main event to the opening act! He was pointing toward Christ when he was pointing at the Kingdom within! (Christ was the

fullness of God manifesting in human form.) John was saying, "Look at Him!" *"He must increase, but I must decrease."* (John 3:30)

- (b) After Christ emerged from the wilderness...Christ was pointing at Himself when He was pointing at the Kingdom within! (Christ was the fullness of God manifesting in human form.) He was saying, "Look at Me!" "I have increased, John has decreased."
- (c) Preach the Kingdom (Y'shua sent out the 12 disciples).What follows this supernatural message is supernatural sings.
 - 1. What is the Kingdom of Heaven, the Gospel of the Kingdom, the Kingdom of God...?
- (d) The kingdom is within you...
 - 1. The Kingdom is at hand when the fullness of God is manifesting in a human.
 - Think Jesus! Jesus was the perfect manifestation of God in man. \And how was that perfection achieved? He was sinless and remained sinless unto death.
 - And what does it mean to be sinless? It means to be perfectly obedient to God's laws, because sin is lawlessness (I John 3:4).

- 4. So, what does it look like when man is sinless?
- 5. It looks like radical grace-empowered, faith-based obedience to God. It looks like Christ!
- 6. How is that possible for you?
- (2) Blood and Light
 - (a) The life of the creature is in the blood.
 - It is clear that for the flesh and blood body, that God intended for the blood to represent its life!
 - (b) But Jesus showed us something deeper about life!
 - Jesus shed his blood because He was more concerned with being filled with light!
 - (c) The life of the creature is in the light...we were given a preview of what that looks like!
 - The Transfiguration: Peter, James and John got a sneak peek at what a human looks like when light replaces blood!
 - (d) New creature—Light replaces blood?
 - (e) He is the light of the world; You are the light of the world! Let you light (transfigured self) shine!
 - (f) What will you look like?
 - 1. It will look like Christ staring back at you when you look in the mirror!
- (3) Reminder!

- (a) You cannot fail in His eyes!
 - Nothing you do can separate you from God's plan.
 You have a job to do! Reflect God's light, His power, His grace!

GRACE STEWARDSHIP

2. Daunting Duties and Responsibilities

A. <u>Available or Mostly Available</u>

- (1) What happens when you become "All Available?"
 - (a) "He must increase, but I must decrease." John 3:30 NKJV
 - "John answered and said, "A man can receive nothing unless it has been given to him from heaven. You yourselves bear me witness, that I said, 'I am not the Christ,' but, 'I have been sent before Him.' He who has the bride is the bridegroom; but the friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly because of the bridegroom's voice. Therefore this joy of mine is fulfilled." John 3:27-29 NKJV
 - a) First come to the sober reality that you have nothing good, no revelation, that does not come from God.

- b) You are not the Christ, but you have come to point to the Christ. In other words, GET OUT OF THE WAY.
- c) Picture it like this: you do all the work and become transparent while doing it. This way when people look toward you, they will see through you at Christ.
- d) *"He must increase, but I must decrease."* John 3:30
- (b) He whom God has sent speaks the words of God...
 - 1. "He who comes from above is above all; he who is of the earth is earthly and speaks of the earth. He who comes from heaven is above all. And what He has seen and heard, that He testifies; and no one receives His testimony. He who has received His testimony has certified that God is true. For He whom God has sent speaks the words of God, for God does not give the Spirit by measure. The Father loves the Son, and has given all things into His hand. He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him."" John 3:31-36 NKJV

- a) Can it be any plainer? If you come as an ambassador for God, you are commissioned to speak the words of God, NOT YOUR OWN!
- (c) Just in case you have any lingering doubt...
 - 1. "Then the disciples of John reported to him concerning all these things. And John, calling two of his disciples to him, sent them to Jesus, saying, "Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?" When the men had come to Him, they said, "John the Baptist has sent us to You, saying, 'Are You the Coming One, or do we look for another?' " And that very hour He cured many of infirmities, afflictions, and evil spirits; and to many blind He gave sight. Jesus answered and said to them, "Go and tell John the things you have seen and heard: that the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, the poor have the gospel preached to them. And blessed is he who is not offended because of Me."" Luke 7:18-23 NKJV
 - a) Are you the one? Should I be considering any other possibility? Answer: an emphatic NO! Have you not witnessed the kingdom in operation?

B. Grace Trustee

- (1) The Grantor and the Trustee—a special relationship between the boss and those called to steward His resources!
 - (a) Since He is the one, and you are His sent ones...
 - A trustee is given control or powers of administration of property in trust, by a grantor, with the legal obligation to administer it **solely for the purposes** specified.
 - After the grantor has passed away or become incapable (in the case of Christ, He finished His job) of administering the trust, a successor trustee (that's you!) steps in to continue making the decisions on behalf of the beneficiaries (the whole world!).
 - 3. The trustee plays an interesting role in administering a trust. Once the grantor has set up the trust, a trustee is appointed **to make decisions** (He gives you power and authority) for the trust that are in the best interest of the beneficiaries (the whole world!).
 - 4. It is important to note that the trustee is **expected to make decisions** (Christ-like) that are in the best interest of the beneficiaries (the whole world!), even if those decisions go against the wishes of the beneficiaries (the World rejected Him).

- 5. The trustee's duty is to see that the decisions made are those that, in the estimation of the trustee, create the most benefit for the trust (the Church) and by extension for the beneficiaries of the trust.
- 6. For that reason, the trustee must be a person the grantor trusts to act with honesty and with sound judgment at all times (a true disciple).
- 7. In many cases, the trustee cannot benefit financially from the trust themselves (it's NOT ABOUT YOU!). In fact, the trust must specifically state that a trustee may benefit in order for them to do so.
- (2) The parable of the poor trustee (steward, administrator, agent, custodian)...
 - (a) Making bad things worse...
 - 1. "He also said to His disciples: "There was a certain rich man who had a steward, and an accusation was brought to him that this man was wasting his goods. So he called him and said to him, 'What is this I hear about you? Give an account of your stewardship, for you can no longer be steward.' "Then the steward said within himself, 'What shall I do? For my master is taking the stewardship away from me. I cannot dig; I am ashamed to beg. I have resolved what to

do, that when I am put out of the stewardship, they may receive me into their houses.' Luke 16:1-4 NKJV

- a) You are designated as the trustee of Christ's mission. If you are doing a bad job, you will be held to account.
- b) The right thing to do is to correct your mistakes and become a faithful trustee who makes decisions for the trust that are in the best interest of the beneficiaries.
- c) The worse thing you can do is to try to find loopholes.
- d) This mindset might be responsible for the formation of many, many denominations.
- e) Definitions:
 - {Denomination} what man does when he wishes to add or take away from God's word, in most cases, so they can continue to disobey God, but to feel good about what they are doing at the same time!
 - {Synonym} religion; legalism; rationalization; compromise; pride
 - {Antonym} Christianity; disciple; truth; faithful; humility

- (b) Pick a side: Faithful or Unjust
 - 1. ""And I say to you, make friends for yourselves by unrighteous mammon, that when you fail, they may receive you into an everlasting home. He who is faithful in what is least is faithful also in much; and he who is unjust in what is least is unjust also in much. Therefore if you have not been faithful in the unrighteous mammon, who will commit to your trust the true riches? And if you have not been faithful in what is another man's, who will give you what is your own? "No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.""Luke 16:9-13 NKJV
 - a) If you cannot be trusted with what God has assigned to you, then you can be certain He will not assign you anything else, until such a time that you become faithful with what you've already been entrusted.
 - b) You cannot serve God at the same time you are serving yourself!

C. <u>Are you available?</u>

- (1) Prerequisites—You shall...
 - (a) Rule #1
 - 1. "You shall utterly destroy all the places where the nations which you shall dispossess served their gods, on the high mountains and on the hills and under every green tree. And you shall destroy their altars, break their sacred pillars, and burn their wooden images with fire; you shall cut down the carved images of their gods and destroy their names from that place. You shall not worship the Lord your God with such things." Deuteronomy 12:2-4 NKJV
 - a) Get rid of ALL paganism and idolatry. You cannot serve Yahweh and ANY OTHER THING at the same time!
 - (b) Rule #2
 - ""But you shall seek the place where the Lord your God chooses, out of all your tribes, to put His name for His dwelling place; and there you shall go." Deuteronomy 12:5 NKJV
 - a) Choose God's will!
 - (c) Rule #3
 - ""You shall not at all do as we are doing here today
 —every man doing whatever is right in his own eyes

— for as yet you have not come to the rest and the inheritance which the Lord your God is giving you." Deuteronomy 12:8-9 NKJV

- a) Stop following your own heart and leave your old life behind!
- (d) Rule #4
 - ""Whatever I command you, be careful to observe it; you shall not add to it nor take away from it." Deuteronomy 12:32 NKJV
 - 2. "Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written in it; for the time is near." Revelation 1:3 NKJV
 - 3. "For I testify to everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: **If anyone adds to these things,** God will add to him the plagues that are written in this book; and if **anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy,** God shall take away his part from the Book of Life, from the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book." Revelation 22:18-19 NKJV
 - a) Don't make it up! This is the way it is!

b) When you go in and take the promised land, and you defeat the pagan nations, don't develop any interest in anything about their gods or their worship practices. It will lead you down a dark path that will not end well. Trust me, everything they do is an abomination. (See <u>Your Final</u> <u>Testimony</u> about not adding or taking away from God's Word!)

D. Greasy Grace

- (1) Hijacking God's grace in some slimy back alley transaction.
 - (a) No Excuse!
 - "Moreover the law entered that the offense might abound. But where sin abounded, grace abounded much more, so that as sin reigned in death, even so grace might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 5:20-21 NKJV
 - "What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound?" Romans 6:1 NKJV
 - 3. "Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it?"Romans 6:2 NKJV
 - a) Let me make a clear distinction as there are some who use God's grace to excuse abhorrent behavior.

b) Don't do that! It will never work!

E. <u>The Kingdom commission—Spread the power</u>

- (1) Impart Grace to the Hearers
 - (a) Now that you have a complete understanding of God's grace, can you recognize the daunting responsibility to share it with others?!
 - "Let no corrupt word proceed out of your mouth, but what is good for necessary edification, that it may impart grace to the hearers." Ephesians 4:29 NKJV
- (2) Bind and Loose
 - (a) ""Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Matthew 18:18 NKJV
 - 1. ""Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother. But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.' And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector. "Assuredly, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you

loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. "Again I say to you that **if two of you agree on earth concerning anything that they ask, it will be done for them by My Father in heaven.** For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them."" Matthew 18:15-20 NKJV

- a) The power of agreement. When you agree with one another and with Christ, heaven will manifest on earth!
- (3) The Power to forgive sins!
 - (a) "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."" John 20:23 NKJV
 - "Then, the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in the midst, and said to them, "Peace be with you." When He had said this, He showed them His hands and His side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. So Jesus said to them again, "Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them,

"Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."" John 20:19-23 NKJV

- a) Whatever you forgive will be forgiven. Let's pause and wrap our minds around stewarding this responsibility.
- b) But remember, not until your obedience is complete! *"and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled."* II Corinthians 10:6
- (4) Shake the dust off your feet
 - (a) "If the household is worthy, let your peace come upon it. But if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you." Matthew 10:13 NKJV
 - "These twelve Jesus sent out and commanded them, saying: "Do not go into the way of the Gentiles, and do not enter a city of the Samaritans. But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Heal the sick, cleanse the lepers, raise the dead, cast out demons. Freely you have received, freely give. Provide neither gold nor silver nor copper in your money belts, nor bag for your journey, nor two

tunics, nor sandals, nor staffs; for a worker is worthy of his food. "Now whatever city or town you enter, inquire who in it is worthy, and stay there till you go out. And when you go into a household, greet it. **If the household is worthy, let your peace come upon it. But if it is not worthy, let your peace return to you.** And whoever will not receive you nor hear your words, when you depart from that house or city, shake off the dust from your feet. Assuredly, I say to you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment than for that city!" Matthew 10:5-15 NKJV

- a) We are back to where we started. If you impart grace to a perfectly cut, well polished diamond, it will reflect the glory of God. If you shed your light on a lump of coal, you are likely to get nothing back but dusty feet.
- b) Shake off the dust and move on!
- c) Let your light shine— ""You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before

men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:14-16 NKJV

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 - 2. Shake off the dust and move on!
 - 3. Let your light shine!
