SPIRITUAL VIOLENCE

- The Army of God
- Violence
- Force

I have no doubt that the words themselves will invoke strong emotions, and you may not like them. They often settle in your soul in a certain place, very likely in the location reserved for where negative feelings go to dwell. The words are 'violence' and 'violent.' 'Violence' describes a type of behavior, often involving physical force intended to hurt, damage, or even kill. It is an unpleasant or destructive force used for intimidation, oftentimes unlawful. Synonyms that describe 'violent' include brutal, savage, cruel, sadistic, barbarous, murderous, bloodthirsty, ruthless, inhumane, heartless, and merciless. These certainly reside in the home reserved for negative emotions. Even its antonyms prove where violence undoubtedly lives in your soul: gentleness, kindness, and mildness.

Today, I will also include a few other thoughts to help add to your frame of reference. I wish to reframe violence in your mind,

not to eliminate the above, just add to it. And, I'll use this bible passage to show both sides of the violence coin, how it's actually a double-edged sword. "THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN SUFFERS VIOLENCE, AND THE VIOLENT TAKE IT BY FORCE." How I defined it above certainly conveys the proper understanding of "violence" in this verse; the kingdom of heaven is being violated by destructive forces. But "the violent", who take it by force, is something different. It best describes the necessary actions of spiritually violent men who MUST use violence to fiercely defend the kingdom against destructive forces, those who also wrestle ferociously to establish the kingdom of heaven on earth. Yes, proper descriptors for these men live in positive emotions territory. Think ferocious, intense, vehement, fervent, ardent, zealous, and fierce. Spiritually fierce men defend the kingdom; ferocious men take the kingdom by force.

These warriors protect the kingdom and then overtake it! How? The Scripture says... by force! What kind of force? It's not what you think. It's not brute force. It's not physical force. It is spiritual force! Sure, at times it appears like fire from heaven; but other times it overcomes the unlawful violence against the kingdom by turning the other cheek. And then there is the intense violence of meekness, the most ferocious spiritual force of all. This is the power to do nothing when you have the power to do everything.

PROPHETIC SEED:

"The armed men went before the priests who blew the trumpets, and the rear guard came after the ark, while the priests continued blowing the trumpets." Joshua 6:9 NKJV

PROPHETIC FRUIT:

"And from the days of John the Baptist until now **the kingdom of heaven** suffers **violence**, and **the violent** take it by force." Matthew 11:12 NKJV

Let's Set the Scene: Portion in a blurb

Introduction

We already saw Yahweh commission Joshua; the order to cross the Jordan; the testimony of Rahab and the spies; and then witnessed the priests enter the water with the Ark and the miracle of the waters being held back, so all of Israel could cross over the Jordan on dry ground (See: <u>Baptism on Dry Ground</u>). We learned about two sets of memorial stones, one on each side of the river, placed there as a reminder to all generations of the miracle that took place that day.

Now, the generation permitted to enter the promised land must be circumcised as there was none taking place in the wilderness. Joshua then encounters the "Commander" of the Lord's army who meets him to give him strict instructions. It's time to take down the walls of Jericho.

Joshua 5

The Second Generation is Circumcised

- 1. All the kings of the Amorites and Canaanites heard that the Lord had dried up the waters of the Jordan and made way for Israel to cross over on dry ground, and their hearts melted with fear.
- 2. The Lord tells Joshua to make flint knives to circumcise the sons of Israel. All the males who came out of Egypt 40 years earlier had been circumcised and have now died.
- 3. All the males born in the wilderness had not yet been circumcised, so now was the time.
- 4. After they had finished circumcising, they stayed in their places in the camp till they were healed.
- 5. Then the Lord said to Joshua, "This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you." (Calls the place Gilgal)
- 6. Israel camps in Gilgal, and keeps the Passover on the plains of Jericho.
- 7. They eat the produce of the land, unleavened bread and parched grain (on the first day of the Feast Unleavened Bread).

- 8. Then the manna ceased on that day. (Israel no longer had manna, but they ate the food of the land of Canaan that year.)
 - (a) Note: the wilderness is symbolic of childhood, a place of supernatural provision—rocks give water, heaven gives bread, and sandals don't wear out. Why? Because children cannot provide for themselves.
 - (b) The promised land is a place of adulthood. You have now got to take what you've learned and apply it, like a responsible adult. "Now, go take the the land!"

Joshua Meets the Commander of the Army of the Lord

- 9. Joshua was by Jericho and he meets a Man with His sword drawn.
- 10. Joshua inquires: "Are You for us or for our adversaries?"
- 11. The Man simply informs Joshua: "No, but as Commander of the army of the Lord I have now come."
- 12. Joshua worships Him and asks, "What does my Lord say to His servant?"
- 13. The Commander tells Joshua, "Take your sandal off your foot, for the place where you stand is holy."
- 14. Note: The idea that Joshua worshiped "the Man" and he was not corrected for doing so intimates that this may be the pre-incarnate Christ.

- 15. When John bowed down to worship an angel, we was stopped from doing so—
 - (a) "Now I, John, saw and heard these things. And when I heard and saw, I fell down to worship before the feet of the angel who showed me these things. Then he said to me, "See that you do not do that. For I am your fellow servant, and of your brethren the prophets, and of those who keep the words of this book. Worship God."" Revelation 22:8-9 NKJV

Joshua 6

The Destruction of Jericho

- 16. Jericho was on lockdown because they knew what was coming!
- 17. Yahweh tells Joshua: "I have given Jericho, its king and its mighty men."

18. Here is the exact action plan...

- (a) Gather your men of war.
- (b) Line up seven priest with trumpets of rams' horns, followed by the ark. (Those who are armed will advance before the ark, and the rear guard came after the ark.)
- (c) Then march around the city, one time each day for six days.
- (d) On the seventh day march around the city seven times, while the priests blow the trumpets.
- (e) On the seventh trip the priest shall make a long continuous blow of the rams' horns.

- (f) When the people hear the long sound, they shall join in with a great shout.
- (g) And the wall of the city will fall down flat!
- (h) Then, the men shall charge directly into the city and take over!

19. Then Joshua institutes the instructions:

- (a) Joshua tells the people not to make any noise until the day he says to "Shout!' (The only sound until seventh day shall be the sound of trumpets.)
- (b) They do as instructed for six days and on the seventh they marched around the city seven times.
- (c) On the seventh time the priests blew the trumpets and Joshua tells the people, "Shout, for the Lord has given you the city! Now the city shall be doomed by the Lord to destruction, it and all who are in it." (Only Rahab and all who are in her house shall live as promised—See Joshua 2)
- (d) You can take all the silver and gold, and vessels of bronze for the treasury of the Lord, but DO NOT take any pagan paraphernalia.

20. Then it happens...

- (a) The walls fall down.
- (b) They utterly destroy everything in the city (including people and animals).

- (c) Rahab, her family, and her belongings are brought outside the camp of Israel and the city is burned. (The all remained as part of Israel.)
- (d) Only the silver and gold, and the vessels of bronze and iron are put into the treasury.
- 21. Then Joshua warns that no man shall ever rebuild Jericho. If he attempts to do so, it will cost him his children.
- 22. Joshua's fame spreads throughout all the country.

THE ARMY OF GOD

1. Out with the old men of war; in with the new...

A. <u>The Old Guard</u>

- (1) Time again for circumcision!
 - (a) Circumcise the sons of Israel again the second time...
 - "At that time the Lord said to Joshua, "Make flint knives for yourself, and circumcise the sons of Israel again the second time." So Joshua made flint knives for himself, and circumcised the sons of Israel at the hill of the foreskins." Joshua 5:2-3 NKJV
 - (b) Why? The original men of war (who came out of Egypt and who were circumcised) are now dead.
 - "And this is the reason why Joshua circumcised them: All the people who came out of Egypt who

were males, all **the men of war**, had died in the wilderness on the way, after they had come out of Egypt." Joshua 5:4 NKJV

- (c) The old men of war had been circumcised; the new men of war were not YET circumcised!
 - "For all the people who came out had been circumcised, but all the people born in the wilderness, on the way as they came out of Egypt, had not been circumcised." Joshua 5:5 NKJV
- (d) And... you can't miss this! Remember, they crossed the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, four days before Passover.
 - "Now the people came up from the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, and they camped in Gilgal on the east border of Jericho." Joshua 4:19 NKJV
 - a) And they are about to celebrate their first Passover in the Promised Land (see Joshua 5:8-11), so all males who wish to participate must be circumcised! (It's a sign not a religion—See:
 <u>Baptism of Dry Ground</u>)
- (e) You MUST be circumcised to eat the Passover! (See Exodus 12-13)

- "...For no uncircumcised person shall eat it. One law shall be for the native-born and for the stranger who dwells among you."" Exodus 12:48-49 NKJV
- (2) God is looking for men of war who will obey...
 - (a) The warriors for God who exited Egypt were disobedient and they all perished in the wilderness. God is looking for a new breed of warriors who will obey!
 - 1. "For the children of Israel walked forty years in the wilderness, till all the people who were men of war, who came out of Egypt, were consumed, because they did not obey the voice of the Lord—to whom the Lord swore that He would not show them the land which the Lord had sworn to their fathers that He would give us, "a land flowing with milk and honey."" Joshua 5:6 NKJV
 - (b) We are reminded that disobedience was the chief reason that the people could not enter the promised land. So, don't repeat their same mistake.
 - 1. "For who, having heard, rebelled? Indeed, was it not all who came out of Egypt, led by Moses? Now with whom was He angry forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose corpses fell in the

wilderness? And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, but to those who did not obey? So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief." Hebrews 3:16-19 NKJV

- "Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience." Hebrews 4:11 NKJV
- (c) The Next Generation
 - 1. "Then Joshua circumcised their sons whom He raised up in their place; for they were uncircumcised, because they had not been circumcised on the way." Joshua 5:7 NKJV
 - a) Those 20 and under who came out in the Exodus, who survived into the Promised Land, were already circumcised. This circumcision is for those born in the wilderness, so they can eat the Passover.
- (3) The First Passover in the Promised Land
 - (a) This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you! This means that the were NOT carrying the sins of Egypt (nor their fathers) into the Promised Land.
 - "So it was, when they had finished circumcising all the people, that they stayed in their places in the

camp till they were healed. Then the Lord said to Joshua, **"This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you."** Therefore the name of the place is called Gilgal to this day. Now the children of Israel camped in Gilgal, **and kept the Passover on the fourteenth day of the month at twilight** on the plains of Jericho. **And they ate of the produce of the land** on **the day after the Passover**, unleavened bread and parched grain, on the very same day." Joshua 5:8-11 NKJV

- (4) The supernatural gives way to the natural...
 - (a) Once Israel consummated their residency in the land, the supernatural provision of the wilderness ended.
 - "Then the manna ceased on the day after they had eaten the produce of the land; and the children of Israel no longer had manna, but they ate the food of the land of Canaan that year." Joshua 5:12 NKJV
 - It is interesting that the Passover signifies the end. It was the end of Egypt (as a world power) at the Exodus. And it is the end of the provision for helpless (spiritual) children in the wilderness.
 - 2. They have been identified as sons and now are recognized spiritually as young adults.

B. The New Guard

- (1) A new army of the Lord, one armed with spiritual violence!
 - (a) Joshua encounters the Commander of the army of the Lord...
 - "And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted his eyes and looked, and behold, a Man stood opposite him with His sword drawn in His hand. And Joshua went to Him and said to Him, "Are You for us or for our adversaries?" So He said, "No, but as Commander of the army of the Lord I have now come." And Joshua fell on his face to the earth and worshiped, and said to Him, "What does my Lord say to His servant?"" Joshua 5:13-14 NKJV
 - 1. The fact that Joshua worshiped "the Man" and he was not corrected for doing so, as John was by an angel, intimates that this a divine figure, maybe the pre-incarnate Christ.
 - 2. "...John, ...fell down to worship before the feet of the angel ... Then he said to me, "See that you do not do that. For I am your fellow servant... Worship God."" Revelation 22:8-9 NKJV

(2) Holy Ground

- (a) The Commander gives Joshua the same order that Moses received at the burning bush.
 - "Then the Commander of the Lord's army said to Joshua, "Take your sandal off your foot, for the place where you stand is holy." And Joshua did so." Joshua 5:15 NKJV
 - "Then He said [to Moses], "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground."" Exodus 3:5 NKJV
 - a) Same directive—Joshua is about to embark on his conquest of the Promised Land; Moses was about to embark on his conquest to free Israel from Egypt.
 - b) Both men are requested to take off their sandals because they are standing on Holy Ground!
 - c) I believe the picture here is less about the ground and more about the man! What type of man must you become to go on this assignment for Yahweh?
 - "Therefore, since all these things will be dissolved, *what manner of persons ought you to be in holy conduct* and godliness," II Peter 3:11 NKJV

- d) This is our precise calling at this time: (See: <u>The</u> <u>End of the Beginning</u>)
 - "When you come into the land...Three years [the fruit] shall be as uncircumcised to you. It shall not be eaten. But <u>in the fourth year all its</u> <u>fruit shall be holy, ...</u>in the fifth year you may eat its fruit, ...its increase: ... " Leviticus 19:23-25 NKJV
- (b) Prophetic Precedent
 - 1. Take notice...when exact words are repeated in the Scripture, it connects those events to each other, and quite possibly to other areas in the Scriptures that do the same!
 - a) When Moses was called to holiness, it requiredSpiritual Violence! (Plagues)
 - b) When Joshua was called to holiness, it requiredSpiritual Violence! (Jericho)
 - 2. Other areas this happens:
 - a) Y'shua's Baptism: "When He had been baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and behold, the heavens were opened to Him, and He saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting upon Him. And suddenly a voice came

from heaven, saying, **"This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."**" Matthew 3:16-17 NKJV

- b) Y'shua's Transfiguration: "While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and suddenly a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!"" Matthew 17:5 NKJV
- c) John acknowledges the kingdom: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"" Matthew 3:2
 NKJV
- d) Y'shua acknowledges the kingdom: "From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.""Matthew 4:17 NKJV
- 3. What connects these events—their first occurrence to their second occurrence?
 - a) The Burning bush... Exodus 3:5
 - b) The Commander of the Lord's army... Joshua 5:15
 - c) Y'shua's Baptism... Matthew 3:16-17
 - d) Y'shua's Transfiguration... Matthew 17:5
 - e) John acknowledges the kingdom...Matthew 3:2
 - f) Y'shua acknowledges the kingdom...Matthew 4:17

- 4. They all have this in common...the initiating event is the calling, and the follow-up event is the fulfillment. In other words, the second event in each instance is YOUR DESTINY! The Promised Land, The Transfiguration, The Kingdom!
- 5. After the transfiguration (the sneak peek at glorified man), Peter is instructed to tell no one until the proper time!
 - a) "Now as they came down from the mountain,
 Jesus commanded them, saying, "Tell the vision to
 no one until the Son of Man is risen from the
 dead."" Matthew 17:9 NKJV
- 6. It is time! "And so we have the prophetic word confirmed... II Peter 1:19 NKJV
 - a) "For we did not follow cunningly devised fables when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but were eyewitnesses of His majesty. For He received from God the Father honor and glory when such a voice came to Him from the Excellent Glory: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." And we heard this voice which came from heaven

when we were with Him on the holy mountain." II Peter 1:16-18 NKJV

- (3) Military Stripes (Spiritual Violence of the US Military)
 - (a) US Army
 - 1. Motto: "This We'll Defend"
 - a) "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you..." I Peter 3:15 NKJV
 - (b) US Navy (no official motto—a few unofficial)
 - 1. Motto: "Ready to Lead, Ready to Follow, Never Quit."
 - a) "And the things that you have heard from me among many witnesses, commit these to faithful men who will be able to teach others also." II Timothy 2:2 NKJV
 - Motto US Navy Seals: "The only easy day was yesterday!"
 - a) "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world."" John 16:33 NKJV
 - (c) US Air Force (the Prayer Force!)
 - 1. Motto: "Aim High ... Fly-Fight-Win"

- a) "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in
 everything give thanks; for this is the will of God
 in Christ Jesus for you." I Thessalonians 5:16-18
 NKJV
- (d) US Marines
 - 1. Motto: (Semper Fidelis) "Always Faithful"
 - a) "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him." Hebrews 11:6 NKJV

C. The Precedent—the obedience of the new men of war

- (1) A look back...the long game—
 - (a) The original men of war did not obey (See Joshua 5:6 *"They were consumed, because they did not obey the voice of the Lord"*)...and the next generation of warriors are REMINDED that they'd better obey, as ARE WE!
 (*"Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience."* Hebrews 4:11)
 - "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way

prosperous, and then you will have good success." Joshua 1:8 NKJV

- (b) Notice the order of business...
 - "So the priests who bore the ark stood in the midst of the Jordan until everything was finished that the Lord had <u>commanded</u> Joshua to speak to the people, according to all that Moses had commanded Joshua; and the people hurried and crossed over. Then it came to pass, when all the people had completely crossed over, that the ark of the Lord and the priests crossed over in the presence of the people." Joshua 4:10-11 NKJV
 - a) Every Israelite ultimately passes over BEFORE the ark!
- (2) We are looking for men of war to cross over!
 - (a) Men who will be Spiritually Violent....
 - NOTE: "And the men of Reuben, the men of Gad, and half the tribe of Manasseh <u>crossed over armed</u> <u>before the children of Israel</u>, as Moses had spoken to them. About forty thousand <u>prepared for war</u> crossed over before the Lord for battle, to the plains of Jericho."Joshua 4:12-13 NKJV

- (b) And to... "...Come up from the Jordan..." Joshua 4:15-18
- (c) And to stand **opposite Jericho** (the enemy)... Joshua 3:15-16
- (3) And then to tear down Jericho...but you MUST take notice of these two things! Who went before the Ark and how did the walls come down?
 - (a) Who? Men of War (armed men prepared for battle)!
 - (b) How? Spiritual Violence (not brute force)!
- (4) It's time to tear down your Jericho (Joshua 6:1-27)
 - (a) The Destruction of Jericho
 - Jericho was on lockdown because they knew what was coming! Yahweh tells Joshua: "I have given Jericho, its king and its mighty men." (Joshua 6:1-2)
 - (b) Here is the exact action plan... (Joshua 6:3-14)
 - 1. Gather your men of war:
 - a) "You shall march around the city, all you men of war; you shall go all around the city once. This you shall do six days." Joshua 6:3 NKJV
 - 2. Line up seven priest with trumpets of rams' horns, followed by the ark. (Those who are armed will advance **before the ark**, and the rear guard came after the ark.)

- a) **"The armed men went before the priests** who blew the trumpets, and the rear guard came after the ark, while the priests continued blowing the trumpets." Joshua 6:9 NKJV
- b) Please don't miss this! Those who advance
 BEFORE the ark are armed men of war, and as we already took note of, every Israelite advanced
 BEFORE the ark when they crossed the Jordan.
 Every Israelite (those who overcome with God) has been called to battle as "armed men of war!"
- 3. They march around the city, one time each day for six days with the armed men leading the way!
 - a) "Then seven priests bearing seven trumpets of rams' horns before the ark of the Lord went on continually and blew with the trumpets. **And the armed men went before them.** But the rear guard came after the ark of the Lord, while the priests continued blowing the trumpets." Joshua 6:13 NKJV
- 4. On the seventh day they march around the city seven times, while the priests blow the trumpets.
- 5. On the seventh trip the priests shall make a long continuous blow of the rams' horns.

- 6. When the people hear the long sound, they shall join in with a great shout. And the wall of the city will fall down flat! (Spiritual Force! Spiritual Violence!)
- 7. Then, the men shall charge directly into the city and take over!
- (c) Joshua institutes God's instructions precisely:
 - Joshua tells the people not to make any noise until the day he says to "Shout!' (The only sound until seventh day shall be the sound of trumpets.)
 - 2. They do as instructed for six days and on the seventh they marched around the city seven times.
 - 3. On the seventh time the priests blew the trumpets and Joshua tells the people, *"Shout, for the Lord has* given you the city! Now the city shall be doomed by the Lord to destruction, it and all who are in it." (Only Rahab and all who are in her house shall live as promised—See Joshua 2) The city shall be doomed, but remember to spare Rahab and her family. They will live as part of Israel...(Joshua 6:17, 22-23, 25)
 - 4. Warning to God's Warriors: You can take all the silver and gold, and vessels of bronze for the treasury of the Lord, but DO NOT take any pagan paraphernalia.

- (d) Then it happens...
 - 1. The walls fall down.
 - 2. They utterly destroy everything in the city (including people and animals).
 - 3. Rahab, her family, and her belongings are brought outside the camp of Israel and the city is burned. (The all remained as part of Israel.)
- (5) **WARNING:** (see: <u>Post Mortem Imperative</u>) Don't ever forget what God has instructed. If you do, bad things happen!
 - (a) Don't ever go back—don't ever rebuild what God has destroyed. It will cost you your most valuable possession (your children). Take only what God has commanded you to take.
 - 1. "And you, by all means abstain from the accursed things, lest you become accursed when you take of the accursed things, and make the camp of Israel a curse, and trouble it. But all the silver and gold, and vessels of bronze and iron, are consecrated to the Lord; they shall come into the treasury of the Lord."" Joshua 6:18-19 NKJV
 - "But they burned the city and all that was in it with fire. Only the silver and gold, and the vessels of

bronze and iron, they put into the treasury of the house of the Lord." Joshua 6:24 NKJV

- 3. "Then Joshua charged them at that time, saying, "Cursed be the man before the Lord who rises up and builds this city Jericho; he shall lay its foundation with his firstborn, and with his youngest he shall set up its gates."" Joshua 6:26 NKJV
- (b) Don't rebuild your Jericho!
 - 1. "Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God. For we have spent enough of our past lifetime in doing the will of the Gentiles—when we walked in lewdness, lusts, drunkenness, revelries, drinking parties, and abominable idolatries. In regard to these, they think it strange that you do not run with them in the same flood of dissipation, speaking evil of you." I Peter 4:1-4 NKJV
 - a) Don't go back into the wilderness
 - b) Don't go back to Egypt
 - c) Don't go back to disobedience.

- d) Going back will dissipate your Spiritual Force and Spiritual Violence!
- e) "For he who lacks these things is shortsighted, even to blindness, and has forgotten that he was cleansed from his old sins." II Peter 1:9 NKJV
- (c) Go forward...(last verse of Joshua 6)
 - 1. "So **the Lord was with Joshua, and his fame spread** throughout all the country." Joshua 6:27 NKJV

D. 16 weapons needed for the new army of God!

- (1) Violence & Force
 - (a) Spiritual Violence
 - 1. Know the Word (Who is He?)
 - 2. Know His Voice (Who is speaking?)
 - 3. Know the Prophecy (Where are we going? When will we go & how we will get there?)
 - 4. Know Your Enemy (Who is he? Who are they?)
 - 5. Know Your Identity (Who were you? Who are you?)
 - 6. Know Your Capability (What can you do? What is your power?)
 - 7. Know Your Destiny (What is your role?)
 - 8. Know Your Authority (What is your position?)
 - (b) Spiritual Force

- Prayer (What do you say? What language do you speak? What language does the Spirit speak?)
- 2. Fasting (What will you surrender? What will you not return to?)
- 3. Faith (What do you believe? What will you practice believing? What are your testimonies?)
- 4. Obedience (How will you act? What do do? What will you not do?)
- Service (How will you serve? Who will you serve? What is your commission?)
- 6. Sacrifice (How much will you give up?)
- 7. Meekness (How will you moderate your power and exercise authority? Will you recognize the timing?)
- 8. Love (Who will you emulate?)
- 9. Bonus: Praise and Worship!
- (2) Notable examples of Spiritual Violence and Spiritual Force
 - (a) The violent take it by force...we all have more at our disposal than John!
 - "Assuredly, I say to you, among those born of women there has not risen one greater than John the Baptist; but he who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffers

violence, **and the violent take it by force.** For all the prophets and the law prophesied until John." Matthew 11:11-13 NKJV

- (b) Herod and the worms (See: <u>Fire, Worms & Warring</u> <u>Angels</u>)
 - 1. "So on a set day Herod, arrayed in royal apparel, sat on his throne and gave an oration to them. And the people kept shouting, "The voice of a god and not of a man!" Then immediately an angel of the Lord struck him, because he did not give glory to God. And he was eaten by worms and died. But the word of God grew and multiplied." Acts 12:21-24 NKJV
 - a) Herod accepted worship as if he was God, and he was eaten alive by worms, at the direction of an angel.
 - b) We have access to said angels: "But to which of the angels has He ever said: "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool"? Are they [angels] not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who will inherit salvation?" Hebrews 1:13-14 NKJV
- (c) David and Goliath (not by the sword!) See: I Samuel 17
 - 1. David to Saul: Your servant will go and fight.

- 2. Saul to David: You are not able.
- 3. **David to Saul:** From my youth I've had supernatural spiritual violence—I kill lions and bears bare handed.
- Saul clothes David with his armor; David says, "I cannot walk with these!"
- 5. David chooses a sling and five smooth stones instead!
- 6. **Spiritual Violence:** David to the Philistine: "You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin...I come to you in the name of the Lord."
- 7. **Spiritual Force:** The Lord will deliver you into my hand, I will strike you; you will die; and all the earth may know the true God in Israel.
- 8. All will know the battle is the Lord's [Spiritual violence] and He defeats our enemies! [Spiritual force].
- David hurried toward the enemy army [as an army of one]. He puts his hand in his bag [of spiritual weapons] and sinks a spiritual stone into Goliath's forehead.
- 10. David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone; there was no sword in the hand of David.
- 11. Then he uses the enemies sword to cut off his head.

- (d) David spares Saul (Meekness: not exercising the power in your hand.) **See: I Samuel 24**
 - 1. Saul is seeking to kill David.
 - 2. David finds Saul alone in a cave attending to his needs (urinating).
 - 3. Saul is alone, exposed, and vulnerable.
 - 4. **David's men to David:** "You got him. The Lord has delivered your enemy into your hand. Do what seems good to you!"
 - 5. David sneaks up and cuts off a corner of Saul's robe.
 - 6. David to his men: "God forbid that I should hurt the Lord's anointed!" David restrains his men.
 - 7. Saul leaves the cave unharmed.
 - 8. David to Saul: "Today the Lord delivered you into my hands in the cave. I was urged to kill you! But I spared. See the corner of your robe in my hand as proof I had you in a vulnerable spot! But, I did not kill you. This proves I am not a rebel. I have not sinned against you."
 - 9. Saul to David: "You are more righteous than I; What kind of man finds his enemy, and lets him get away safely? It is a man listening to and rewarded by the Lord." It is a meek man!

- (e) Y'shua cast out the spirits and healed the sick with a word!
 - "When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "He Himself took our infirmities And bore our sicknesses."" Matthew 8:16-17 NKJV
- (f) The fire of Yahweh consumes Aarons sons!
 - "Then Nadab and Abihu, the sons of Aaron, each took his censer and put fire in it, put incense on it, and offered profane fire before the Lord, which He had not commanded them. So fire went out from the Lord and devoured them, and they died before the Lord." Leviticus 10:1-2 NKJV

VIOLENCE ("THE VIOLENT") ATTITUDE

2. The New Army of God (Strategic Tools)

A. Know the Word

- (1) Who is He?
 - (a) He is the Word made flesh who made all things from the beginning. He is the life and light of men!

- 1. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. And the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. ...And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." John 1:1-5, 14 NKJV
- (b) He is the double edged sword; a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart; that which exposes all things!
 - "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account." Hebrews 4:12-13 NKJV
- (c) He is the sword of the Spirit!

- "And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God;" Ephesians 6:17 NKJV
- (d) Delight in Him by meditating on Him day and night, so all you do prospers! That is what Joshua would do; that is what David would do; that is what Paul would do!
 - "This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success." Joshua 1:8 NKJV
 - 2. "Blessed is the man Who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful; **But his delight is in the law of the Lord, And in His law he meditates day and night.** He shall be like a tree Planted by the rivers of water, That brings forth its fruit in its season, Whose leaf also shall not wither; **And whatever he does shall prosper.**" Psalms 1:1-3 NKJV
 - 3. "Finally, brethren, **whatever things are** true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever

things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—**meditate on these things. The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do,** and the God of peace will be with you." Philippians 4:8-9 NKJV

B. Know His Voice

- (1) Who is speaking?
 - (a) We were gifted the faith to become Christians and to that faith the first thing we must do is to know what is right in God's eyes. We must be able to discern His heart and His will on all matters! How?
 - "But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge," II Peter 1:5 NKJV
 - (b) His sheep hear His voice, and they follow! Nothing can snatch them from His hands!
 - 1. "My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me. And I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; neither shall anyone snatch them out of My hand. My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of My Father's hand. I and My Father are one."" John 10:27-30 NKJV

- (c) Know His Word to know His voice!
 - "For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me; for he wrote about Me. But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?"" John 5:46-47 NKJV

C. Know the Prophecy

- (1) Where are we going? When will we go and how we will get there?
 - (a) Christ is the spirit of prophecy! Why? Because you need the Holy Spirit to spiritually discern what God is doing in the earth, to unravel His mysteries!
 - "...Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy."" Revelation 19:10 NKJV
 - 2. "However, we speak wisdom among those who are mature [Developing their spiritual adulthood and muscle], yet not the wisdom of this age, nor of the rulers of this age, who are coming to nothing. But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, the hidden wisdom which God ordained before the ages for our glory, which none of the rulers of this age knew; for had they known, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, Nor have entered into the heart of man

The things which God has prepared for those who love Him." But God has revealed them to us through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep things of God." I Corinthians 2:6-10 NKJV

- (b) Prophetic words will always be confirmed, they are always by the Holy Spirit, and never of private interpretation without confirmation.
 - "And so we have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts; knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit." II Peter 1:19-21 NKJV
- (c) Test all things...test the spirits! Guard against false prophets!
 - "Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies. Test all things; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil." I Thessalonians 5:19-22 NKJV
 - "Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits, whether they are of God; because many false

prophets have gone out into the world." I John 4:1 NKJV

- (d) But, it is also apparent that we have the call of prophecy on our lives, because it has been given to us to discover the mysteries of the kingdom.
 - "He answered and said to them, "Because it has been given to you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it has not been given." Matthew 13:11 NKJV
- (e) Special Note: If you seek to develop these spiritual muscles, and you forget that love is what is most important, then your prophetic knowledge is useless.
 - "And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing." I Corinthians 13:2 NKJV

D. Know Your Enemy

- (1) Who is he? Who are they?
 - (a) Recognize that the enemy uses suffering to lower your defenses, so he can sneak in and devour you. Suffering is part of God's growth plan. It does not have to be that the enemy is causing the suffering, he is just

strategically using the suffering you are already experiencing. Be clear headed and focused; pay attention to the enemy's strategies.

- "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world." I Peter 5:8-9 NKJV
- (b) The most critical battle you will ever face is spiritual warfare. The way to victory in spiritual warfare is with spiritual violence.
 - "For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places." Ephesians 6:12 NKJV
- (c) The least of your concerns should be about this physical life. Spiritual things are what truly matter.
 - "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." Matthew 10:28 NKJV

E. Know Your Identity

(1) Who were you? Who are you?

- (a) You are a new creation, your old life of sin has passed away. Therefore, you are no longer slaves to sin. Now you are a child of God filled with the Spirit of God. You have literally been adopted by God as His child, which gives you the exact inheritance as Christ
 - "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new." II Corinthians 5:17 NKJV
 - 2. "knowing this, that our old man was crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin." Romans 6:6 NKJV
 - 3. "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, **these are sons of God.** For you did **not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption** by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father." The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that **we are children of God,** and if children, then heirs heirs of God and **joint heirs with Christ**, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together."Romans 8:14-17 NKJV

- (b) You should no longer walk as you are the same person you were before you were born again. You have not learned that way in Christ. You have learned this truth: put off your former of conduct, the ways of the old man. And put on the conduct of a new man, which is righteousness and holiness.
 - 1. "This I say, therefore, and testify in the Lord, that you **should no longer walk** as the rest of the Gentiles walk, in the futility of their mind, having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the blindness of their heart; who, being past feeling, have given themselves over to lewdness, to work all uncleanness with greediness. **But you** have not so learned Christ, if indeed you have heard Him and have been taught by Him, as the truth is in Jesus: that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceitful lusts, and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and that you **put on the new man which** was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness." Ephesians 4:17-24 NKJV

F. Know Your Capability

- (1) What can you do? What is your power? (See: Indomitable Grace)
 - (a) You have power available in you, the same power that raised Christ from the grave.
 - "the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may know what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the **exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe**, according to the working of **His mighty power which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead** and seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly places," Ephesians 1:18-20 NKJV
 - (b) With that power anything is possible, as long as it is the will of God.
 - "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13 NKJV
 - 2. "Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that **if we ask anything according to His will,** He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that **we have the petitions that we have asked of Him**." I John 5:14-15 NKJV

G. Know Your Destiny

- (1) What is your role?
 - (a) You are called to be an exact representative of God in the earth. You are an ambassador, as if everything God is doing in the earth is happening through you.
 - 1. "Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation, that is, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them, and has committed to us the word of reconciliation. Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ's behalf, be reconciled to God. For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." II Corinthians 5:18-21 NKJV

H. Know Your Authority

- (1) What is your position?
 - (a) Christ has all the authority in the universe, and He passed it on to you like a runner in a relay race passes on a baton. You are charged with faithfully carrying that authority.

- 1. "And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen." Matthew 28:18-20 NKJV
- (b) Satan is active in the earth, but you have been given complete authority over him and all his activities.
 - 1. "And He said to them, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Behold, I give you the authority to trample on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy, and nothing shall by any means hurt you. Nevertheless do not rejoice in this, that the spirits are subject to you, but rather rejoice because your names are written in heaven."" Luke 10:18-20 NKJV

FORCE ("TAKE IT BY FORCE") ACTION

3. Mostly peaceful protests (Strategic Weapons)

A. <u>Prayer</u>

- (1) What do you say? What language do you speak? What language does the Spirit speak?
 - (a) Everything in prayer, all requests come before God. Do this and you will have a life of peace
 - "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7 NKJV
 - (b) Confess your sins and be repentant; pray for others;Prayer should be fervent!
 - "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." James 5:16 NKJV
 - (c) If you don't know what to pray, the Holy Spirit will intercede for you. God knows everything that is on your heart and what you need.

- 1. "Likewise the Spirit also helps in our weaknesses. For we do not know what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit Himself makes intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Now He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God." Romans 8:26-27 NKJV
- (d) Prayer must be according to God's will only!
 - 1. "Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that **if we ask anything according to His will,** He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that **we have the petitions that we have asked of Him**." I John 5:14-15 NKJV
- (e) Pray nonstop, in your mind, at all times measuring things against God's will. Rejoice and give thanks constantly.
 - "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." I Thessalonians 5:16-18 NKJV

B. Fasting

- (1) What will you surrender? What will you not return to?
 - (a) Fasting means abstinence. Whatever you are abstaining from you are fasting from. Fasting from the basic needs

of life like food is a powerful mechanism used to "crucify your flesh." Sometimes the only way to win a spiritual battle is to engage in this type of dominion over your own flesh.

- "So He said to them, "This kind can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting."" Mark 9:29 NKJV
- (b) Both Moses and Jesus fasted for 40 days. Supernaturally, Moses fasted without food or water.
 - "So he [Moses] was there with the Lord forty days and forty nights; he neither ate bread nor drank water. And He wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the Ten Commandments." Exodus 34:28 NKJV
 - "Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry." Matthew 4:1-2 NKJV
- (c) Esther's fast was a life and death matter. I recommend you read the entire book of Esther. Esther needed to approach the king without an invitation, which usually was a death sentence. She fasted, and invited others to join her, so she would find favor with the king. She needed him to be aware that he had inadvertently

ordered a death sentence for her people, and that he must reverse it!

- 1. "Then Esther told them to reply to Mordecai: "Go, gather all the Jews who are present in Shushan, and fast for me; neither eat nor drink for three days, night or day. My maids and I will fast likewise. And so I will go to the king, which is against the law; and if I perish, I perish!" So Mordecai went his way and did according to all that Esther commanded him." Esther 4:15-17 NKJV
- (d) Don't ever go back to what you surrendered!
 - "Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us," Hebrews 12:1 NKJV

C. <u>Faith</u>

- (1) What do you believe? What will you practice believing?What are your testimonies?
 - (a) Without faith it is impossible to please God. And yet, you must have faith in something you not see. You might say that faith is the opposite of sight.

- "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. For by it the elders obtained a good testimony." Hebrews 11:1-2 NKJV
- 2. "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek
 Him." Hebrews 11:6 NKJV
- (b) The evidence of things not seen. We are challenged with many problems for which we cannot see a solution. And yet we are called to have faith and confess our faith. We don't lose heart! How? We simply should not gain confidence from the things we can see, because they are temporary. Instead, we focus on the things we cannot see—faith!
 - 1. "But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellence of the power may be of God and not of us. We are hard-pressed on every side, yet not crushed; we are perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed— always carrying about in the body the dying of the Lord Jesus, that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our body. For we who live are always delivered to death for Jesus' sake, that the life

of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So then death is working in us, but life in you. And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, "I believed and therefore I spoke," we also believe and therefore speak," II Corinthians 4:7-13 NKJV

2. "Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day. For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory, while we do not look at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen. For the things which are seen are temporary, but the things which are not seen are eternal." II Corinthians 4:16-18 NKJV

(c) Faith is inextricably connected to obedience.

1. "For who, having heard, rebelled? Indeed, was it not all who came out of Egypt, led by Moses? Now with whom was He angry forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose corpses fell in the wilderness? And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, **but to those who did not**

obey? So we see that they could not enter in **because of unbelief.**" Hebrews 3:16-19 NKJV

- (d) A faithless generation thinks there is no answer. But, all things are possible to those who believe, and if you are struggling to believe there is a simple prayer, "Lord I believe, help my unbelief!"
 - 1. "He answered him and said, "O faithless generation, how long shall I be with you? How long shall I bear with you? Bring him to Me." Then they brought him to Him. And when he saw Him, immediately the spirit convulsed him, and he fell on the ground and wallowed, foaming at the mouth. So He asked his father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. And often he has thrown him both into the fire and into the water to destroy him. But if You can do anything, have compassion on us and help us." Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who **believes.**" Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"" Mark 9:19-24 NKJV
- (e) The Faith muscle

 When you have to exercise your faith, you build your faith muscle. Living in faith builds testimonies. If you tell your testimonies God will give you more testimonies to tell.

D. <u>Obedience</u>

- (1) How will you act? What do do? What will you not do?
 - (a) If you love God you will obey God! Obedience is the action side of faith. If you obey God's word, then His love is perfected in you.
 - "And whatever you ask in My name, that I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything in My name, I will do it. "If you love Me, keep My commandments." John 14:13-15 NKJV
 - 2. "Now by this we know that we know Him, if we keep His commandments. He who says, "I know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. But whoever keeps His word, truly the love of God is perfected in him. By this we know that we are in Him. He who says he abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked." I John 2:3-6 NKJV
 - (b) You are a slave to that which you obey. You are either a slave to sin or a slave to righteousness.

 "Do you not know that to whom you present yourselves slaves to obey, you are that one's slaves whom you obey, whether of sin leading to death, or of obedience leading to righteousness?" Romans 6:16 NKJV

E. <u>Service</u>

- (1) How will you serve? Who will you serve? What is your commission?
 - (a) At his last meal before He was betrayed and crucified, Y'shua washed His disciples feet. He did this as an act of service and to serve as an example of how we should serve one another. He did this at the most excruciating time of His life, knowing what was coming. If our Master would do such for us, how then ought we serve one another?
 - 1. "Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God, rose from supper and laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself. After that, He poured water into a basin **and began to wash the disciples' feet**, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded. Then He came to Simon Peter. And Peter said to Him, "Lord, are You

washing my feet?" Jesus answered and said to him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but you will know after this." ... {12} So when He had washed their feet, taken His garments, and sat down again, He said to them, "**Do you know what I have done to you?** You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for so I am. **If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.** For **I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you.** Most assuredly, I say to you, **a servant is not greater than his master;** nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them." John 13:3-7, 12-17 NKJV

- (b) Even the king of the universe did not come to be served, but to be a servant. We are not to rule like pagans, who want to be catered to. Instead, those who desire to be great in the kingdom become servants. And the greatest servants act as slaves for the kingdom.
 - "And when the ten heard it, they began to be greatly displeased with James and John. But Jesus called them to Himself and said to them, "You know that those who are considered rulers over the Gentiles

Lord it over them, and their great ones exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to become great among you shall be your servant. And whoever of you desires to be first shall be slave of all. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."" Mark 10:41-45 NKJV

F. <u>Sacrifice</u>

- (1) How much will you give up?
 - (a) What would you give up to be a disciple? The scriptures say you have to be willing to surrender everything, including your own life. To die is gain!
 - ""If anyone comes to Me and does not hate his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and his own life also, he cannot be My disciple." Luke 14:26 NKJV
 - "So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has cannot be My disciple." Luke 14:33 NKJV
 - "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain."
 Philippians 1:21 NKJV

- (b) You have to be willing to sacrifice everything. Anything you are not willing to let go of will prevent you from following Him!
 - "Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me." But he was sad at this word, and went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions."Mark 10:21-22 NKJV

G. <u>Meekness</u>

- (1) How will you moderate your power and exercise authority? Will you recognize the timing?
 - (a) If you enemy slaps you, turn your cheek; if he needs stole you jacket, simply assume he needed it more that you!
 - 1. "To him who strikes you on the one cheek, offer the other also. And from him who takes away your cloak, do not withhold your tunic either. Give to everyone who asks of you. And from him who takes away your goods do not ask them back. And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise." Luke 6:29-31 NKJV

- (b) At the moment of His betrayal, Y'shua had the ability to defend Himself and to destroy anyone coming against Him. But instead, He stood in submission to the call of His Father on His life. He freely and willingly surrendered His life, even though He had absolute power to destroy His enemies absolutely. He chose not to exercise His power because it was not the proper time and it was better for us that He go to the cross! (See: <u>Fire, Worms & Warring Angels</u>)
 - 1. "But Jesus said to him, "Friend, why have you come?" Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and took Him. And suddenly, one of those who were with Jesus stretched out his hand and drew his sword, struck the servant of the high priest, and cut off his ear. But Jesus said to him, "**Put your sword** in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Or **do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels?** How then could the Scriptures be fulfilled, that it must happen thus?"" Matthew 26:50-54 NKJV

H. Love

(1) Who will you emulate?

- (a) The greatest of all weapons is love. Love has the power to cover anything. And without it, the others simply don't matter!
 - "And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing." I Corinthians 13:2 NKJV
 - "And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love." I Corinthians 13:13 NKJV
 - "And above all things have fervent love for one another, for "love will cover a multitude of sins."" I Peter 4:8 NKJV
- (b) Love is both infinitely complex and simple. God is love. When we know Christ and live in Christ, God's love is manifested in us, and we can then truly love one another. How is God's love manifested perfectly? It was manifested by His sacrifice, sending His son to die in our place. That is the perfect manifestation of love and is precisely how we should treat one another. There is no greater love than to sacrifice your life for another.
 - "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows

God. He who does not love does not know God, for God is love. In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the **propitiation** for our sins. Beloved, **if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.** No one has seen God at any time. If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us. ... {16} And we have known and believed the love that God has for us. **God is love**, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God in him." I John 4:7-12, 16 NKJV

 "This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends." John 15:12-13 NKJV

I. BONUS: Praise & Worship

- (1) When you are surrounded by enemies and there is no conceivable way to victory... (See: II Chronicles 20:1-29)
 - (a) You will NOT need to fight; stand still (just as Moses said at the Red Sea crises in Exodus 14:13)—sing and praise! And your enemies will be defeated!

- "It happened after this that the people of Moab with the people of Ammon, and others with them besides the Ammonites, came to battle against Jehoshaphat." (In Judah and Jerusalem) II Chronicles 20:1 NKJV
- 2. "You will not need to fight in this battle. Position yourselves, stand still and see the salvation of the Lord, who is with you, O Judah and Jerusalem!' Do not fear or be dismayed; tomorrow go out against them, for the Lord is with you."" II Chronicles 20:17 NKJV
- 3. "And when he had consulted with the people, **he appointed those who should sing to the Lord, and who should praise the beauty of holiness,** as they went out before the army and were saying: "Praise the Lord, For His mercy endures forever."" II Chronicles 20:21 NKJV
- 4. "Now when they began to sing and to praise, the Lord set ambushes against the people of Ammon, Moab, and Mount Seir, who had come against Judah; and they were defeated." II Chronicles 20:22 NKJV

J. <u>Final Thoughts</u>

(1) The weapons of our warfare...

- (a) It is high calling. As ambassadors, we are called to punish disobedience. But, only when we have become obedient. Our fight to reach this destinations is not in the flesh, but in the Spirit. Therefore, the weapons we use to win that warfare it's not in the flesh, but in the Spirit. We must exercise Spiritual Violence and Spiritual Force.
 - 1. "For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled." II Corinthians 10:3-6 NKJV
- (2) Daily Practice for home...
 - (a) Put on the Whole Armor of God!
 - "Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers,

against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the **preparation of the gospel** of peace; above all, taking the **shield of faith** with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints— and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may open my mouth **boldly to** make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I **am an ambassador** in chains; that in it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak." Ephesians 6:10-20 NKJV

Summary: THE ARMY OF GOD

1. Out with the old men of war; in with the new...

A. The Old Guard

- (1) Time again for circumcision!
 - (a) Circumcise the sons of Israel again the second time...
 - (b) Why? The original men of war (who came out of Egypt and who were circumcised) are now dead.
 - (c) The old men of war had been circumcised; the new men of war were not YET circumcised!
 - (d) And... you can't miss this! Remember, they crossed the Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, four days before Passover.
 - (e) And they are about to celebrate their first Passover in the Promised Land (see Joshua 5:8-11), so all males who wish to participate must be circumcised! (It's a sign not a religion—See: <u>Baptism of Dry Ground</u>)
 - (f) You MUST be circumcised to eat the Passover! (See Exodus 12-13)
- (2) God is looking for men of war who will obey...
 - (a) The warriors for God who exited Egypt were disobedient and they all perished in the wilderness. God is looking for a new breed of warriors who will obey!

- (b) We are reminded that disobedience was the chief reason that the people could not enter the promised land. So, don't repeat their same mistake.
- (c) The Next Generation: Those 20 and under who came out in the Exodus, who survived into the Promised Land, were already circumcised. This circumcision is for those born in the wilderness, so they can eat the Passover.
- (3) The First Passover in the Promised Land
 - (a) This day I have rolled away the reproach of Egypt from you! This means that the were NOT carrying the sins of Egypt (nor their fathers) into the Promised Land.
- (4) The supernatural gives way to the natural...
 - (a) Once Israel consummated their residency in the land, the supernatural provision of the wilderness ended.
 - (b) It is interesting that the Passover signifies the end. It was the end of Egypt (as a world power) at the Exodus. And it is the end of the provision for helpless (spiritual) children in the wilderness.
 - (c) They have been identified as sons and now are recognized spiritually as young adults.

B. <u>The New Guard</u>

- (1) A new army of the Lord, one armed with spiritual violence!
 - (a) Joshua encounters the Commander of the army of the Lord...
 - (b) The fact that Joshua worshiped "the Man" and he was not corrected for doing so, as John was by an angel, intimates that this a divine figure, maybe the preincarnate Christ.
- (2) Holy Ground
 - (a) The Commander gives Joshua the same order that Moses received at the burning bush.
 - (b) Same directive—Joshua is about to embark on his conquest of the Promised Land; Moses was about to embark on his conquest to free Israel from Egypt.
 - (c) Both men are requested to take off their sandals because they are standing on Holy Ground!
 - (d) I believe the picture here is less about the ground and more about the man! What type of man must you become to go on this assignment for Yahweh?
 - (e) This is our precise calling at this time: (See: <u>The End of</u> <u>the Beginning</u>)
 - (f) Prophetic Precedent

- 1. Take notice...when exact words are repeated in the Scripture, it connects those events to each other, and quite possibly to other areas in the Scriptures that do the same!
 - a) When Moses was called to holiness, it requiredSpiritual Violence! (Plagues)
 - b) When Joshua was called to holiness, it required Spiritual Violence! (Jericho)
- 2. Other areas this happens:
 - a) Y'shua's Baptism: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
 - b) Y'shua's Transfiguration: "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Hear Him!"
 - c) John acknowledges the kingdom: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"
 - d) Y'shua acknowledges the kingdom: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."
- 3. What connects these events—their first occurrence to their second occurrence?
 - a) The Burning bush... Exodus 3:5
 - b) The Commander of the Lord's army... Joshua 5:15
 - c) Y'shua's Baptism... Matthew 3:16-17
 - d) Y'shua's Transfiguration... Matthew 17:5

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- e) John acknowledges the kingdom...Matthew 3:2
- f) Y'shua acknowledges the kingdom...Matthew 4:17
- 4. They all have this in common...the initiating event is the calling, and the follow-up event is the fulfillment. In other words, the second event in each instance is YOUR DESTINY! The Promised Land, The Transfiguration, The Kingdom!
- 5. After the transfiguration (the sneak peek at glorified man), Peter is instructed to tell no one until the proper time!
- 6. It is time! "And so we have the prophetic word confirmed... II Peter 1:19 NKJV
- (3) Military Stripes (Spiritual Violence of the US Military)
 - (a) US Army
 - 1. Motto: "This We'll Defend"
 - (b) US Navy (no official motto—a few unofficial)
 - 1. Motto: "Ready to Lead, Ready to Follow, Never Quit."
 - Motto US Navy Seals: "The only easy day was yesterday!"
 - (c) US Air Force (the Prayer Force!)
 - 1. Motto: "Aim High ... Fly-Fight-Win"
 - (d) US Marines
 - 1. Motto: (Semper Fidelis) "Always Faithful"

C. <u>The Precedent—the obedience of the new men of war</u>

- (1) A look back...the long game—
 - (a) The original men of war did not obey (See Joshua 5:6 *"They were consumed, because they did not obey the voice of the Lord"*)...and the next generation of warriors are REMINDED that they'd better obey, as ARE WE!
 (*"Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience."* Hebrews 4:11)
 - (b) Notice the order of business... Every Israelite ultimately passes over BEFORE the ark!
- (2) We are looking for men of war to cross over!
 - (a) Men who will be Spiritually Violent....
 - (b) And to... "...Come up from the Jordan..."
 - (c) And to stand **opposite Jericho** (the enemy)...
- (3) And then to tear down Jericho...but you MUST take notice of these two things! Who went before the Ark and how did the walls come down?
 - (a) Who? Men of War (armed men prepared for battle)!
 - (b) How? Spiritual Violence (not brute force)!
- (4) It's time to tear down your Jericho (Joshua 6:1-27)
 - (a) The Destruction of Jericho

- Jericho was on lockdown because they knew what was coming! Yahweh tells Joshua: "I have given Jericho, its king and its mighty men."
- (b) Here is the exact action plan...
 - 1. Gather your men of war:
 - 2. Line up seven priest with trumpets of rams' horns, followed by the ark. (Those who are armed will advance **before the ark**, and the rear guard came after the ark.)
 - a) Please don't miss this! Those who advance
 BEFORE the ark are armed men of war, and as we already took note of, every Israelite advanced
 BEFORE the ark when they crossed the Jordan.
 Every Israelite (those who overcome with God) has been called to battle as "armed men of war!"
 - 3. They march around the city, one time each day for six days with the armed men leading the way!
 - 4. On the seventh day they march around the city seven times, while the priests blow the trumpets.
 - 5. On the seventh trip the priests shall make a long continuous blow of the rams' horns.

- 6. When the people hear the long sound, they shall join in with a great shout. And the wall of the city will fall down flat! (Spiritual Force! Spiritual Violence!)
- 7. Then, the men shall charge directly into the city and take over!
- (c) Joshua institutes God's instructions precisely:
 - Joshua tells the people not to make any noise until the day he says to "Shout!' (The only sound until seventh day shall be the sound of trumpets.)
 - 2. They do as instructed for six days and on the seventh they marched around the city seven times.
 - 3. On the seventh time the priests blew the trumpets and Joshua tells the people, *"Shout, for the Lord has* given you the city! Now the city shall be doomed by the Lord to destruction, it and all who are in it." (Only Rahab and all who are in her house shall live as promised—See Joshua 2) The city shall be doomed, but remember to spare Rahab and her family. They will live as part of Israel...
 - 4. Warning to God's Warriors: You can take all the silver and gold, and vessels of bronze for the treasury of the Lord, but DO NOT take any pagan paraphernalia.

- (d) Then it happens...
 - 1. The walls fall down.
 - 2. They utterly destroy everything in the city (including people and animals).
 - 3. Rahab, her family, and her belongings are brought outside the camp of Israel and the city is burned. (The all remained as part of Israel.)
- (5) **WARNING:** (see: <u>Post Mortem Imperative</u>) Don't ever forget what God has instructed. If you do, bad things happen!
 - (a) Don't ever go back—don't ever rebuild what God has destroyed. It will cost you your most valuable possession (your children). Take only what God has commanded you to take.
 - (b) Don't rebuild your Jericho!
 - a) Don't go back into the wilderness
 - b) Don't go back to Egypt
 - c) Don't go back to disobedience.
 - d) Going back will dissipate your Spiritual Force and Spiritual Violence!
 - (c) Go forward...(last verse of Joshua 6)

D. 16 weapons needed for the new army of God!

(1) Violence & Force

- (a) Spiritual Violence
 - 1. Know the Word (Who is He?)
 - 2. Know His Voice (Who is speaking?)
 - 3. Know the Prophecy (Where are we going? When will we go & how we will get there?)
 - 4. Know Your Enemy (Who is he? Who are they?)
 - 5. Know Your Identity (Who were you? Who are you?)
 - 6. Know Your Capability (What can you do? What is your power?)
 - 7. Know Your Destiny (What is your role?)
 - 8. Know Your Authority (What is your position?)
- (b) Spiritual Force
 - 1. Prayer (What do you say? What language do you speak? What language does the Spirit speak?)
 - 2. Fasting (What will you surrender? What will you not return to?)
 - 3. Faith (What do you believe? What will you practice believing? What are your testimonies?)
 - 4. Obedience (How will you act? What do do? What will you not do?)
 - Service (How will you serve? Who will you serve? What is your commission?)
 - 6. Sacrifice (How much will you give up?)

- 7. Meekness (How will you moderate your power and exercise authority? Will you recognize the timing?)
- 8. Love (Who will you emulate?)
- (2) Notable examples of Spiritual Violence and Spiritual Force
 - (a) The violent take it by force...we all have more at our disposal than John!
 - (b) Herod and the worms (See: <u>Fire, Worms & Warring</u> <u>Angels</u>)
 - a) Herod accepted worship as if he was God, and he was eaten alive by worms, at the direction of an angel.
 - b) We have access to said angels:
 - (c) David and Goliath (not by the sword!) See: I Samuel 17
 - 1. **David to Saul:** Your servant will go and fight.
 - 2. Saul to David: You are not able.
 - 3. **David to Saul:** From my youth I've had supernatural spiritual violence—I kill lions and bears bare handed.
 - Saul clothes David with his armor; David says, "I cannot walk with these!"
 - 5. David chooses a sling and five smooth stones instead!

- 6. **Spiritual Violence:** David to the Philistine: "You come to me with a sword, with a spear, and with a javelin...I come to you in the name of the Lord."
- 7. **Spiritual Force:** The Lord will deliver you into my hand, I will strike you; you will die; and all the earth may know the true God in Israel.
- 8. All will know the battle is the Lord's [Spiritual violence] and He defeats our enemies! [Spiritual force].
- David hurried toward the enemy army [as an army of one]. He puts his hand in his bag [of spiritual weapons] and sinks a spiritual stone into Goliath's forehead.
- 10. David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and a stone; there was no sword in the hand of David.
- 11. Then he uses the enemies sword to cut off his head.
- (d) David spares Saul (Meekness: not exercising the power in your hand.) **See: I Samuel 24**
 - 1. Saul is seeking to kill David.
 - 2. David finds Saul alone in a cave attending to his needs (urinating).
 - 3. Saul is alone, exposed, and vulnerable.

- 4. **David's men to David:** "You got him. The Lord has delivered your enemy into your hand. Do what seems good to you!"
- 5. David sneaks up and cuts off a corner of Saul's robe.
- 6. David to his men: "God forbid that I should hurt the Lord's anointed!" David restrains his men.
- 7. Saul leaves the cave unharmed.
- 8. David to Saul: "Today the Lord delivered you into my hands in the cave. I was urged to kill you! But I spared. See the corner of your robe in my hand as proof I had you in a vulnerable spot! But, I did not kill you. This proves I am not a rebel. I have not sinned against you."
- 9. **Saul to David:** "You are more righteous than I; What kind of man finds his enemy, and lets him get away safely? It is a man listening to and rewarded by the Lord." It is a meek man!
- (e) Y'shua cast out the spirits and healed the sick with a word!
- (f) The fire of Yahweh consumes Aarons sons!

Summary: VIOLENCE ("THE VIOLENT") ATTITUDE

2. The New Army of God (Strategic Tools)

A. Know the Word

- (1) Who is He?
 - (a) He is the Word made flesh who made all things from the beginning. He is the life and light of men!
 - (b) He is the double edged sword; a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart; that which exposes all things!
 - (c) He is the sword of the Spirit!
 - (d) Delight in Him by meditating on Him day and night, so all you do prospers! That is what Joshua would do; that is what David would do; that is what Paul would do!

B. <u>Know His Voice</u>

- (1) Who is speaking?
 - (a) We were gifted the faith to become Christians and tothat faith the first thing we must do is to know what isright in God's eyes. We must be able to discern Hisheart and His will on all matters! How?
 - (b) His sheep hear His voice, and they follow! Nothing can snatch them from His hands!
 - (c) Know His Word to know His voice!

C. Know the Prophecy

- (1) Where are we going? When will we go and how we will get there?
 - (a) Christ is the spirit of prophecy! Why? Because you need the Holy Spirit to spiritually discern what God is doing in the earth, to unravel His mysteries!
 - (b) Prophetic words will always be confirmed, they are always by the Holy Spirit, and never of private interpretation without confirmation.
 - (c) Test all things...test the spirits! Guard against false prophets!
 - (d) But, it is also apparent that we have the call of prophecy on our lives, because it has been given to us to discover the mysteries of the kingdom.
 - (e) Special Note: If you seek to develop these spiritual muscles, and you forget that love is what is most important, then your prophetic knowledge is useless.

D. Know Your Enemy

- (1) Who is he? Who are they?
 - (a) Recognize that the enemy uses suffering to lower your defenses, so he can sneak in and devour you. Suffering is part of God's growth plan. It does not have to be that the enemy is causing the suffering, he is just strategically using the suffering you are already

experiencing. Be clear headed and focused; pay attention to the enemy's strategies.

- (b) The most critical battle you will ever face is spiritual warfare. The way to victory in spiritual warfare is with spiritual violence.
- (c) The least of your concerns should be about this physical life. Spiritual things are what truly matter.

E. Know Your Identity

- (1) Who were you? Who are you?
 - (a) You are a new creation, your old life of sin has passed away. Therefore, you are no longer slaves to sin. Now you are a child of God filled with the Spirit of God. You have literally been adopted by God as His child, which gives you the exact inheritance as Christ
 - (b) You should no longer walk as you are the same person you were before you were born again. You have not learned that way in Christ. You have learned this truth: put off your former of conduct, the ways of the old man. And put on the conduct of a new man, which is righteousness and holiness.

F. Know Your Capability

(1) What can you do? What is your power? (See: Indomitable Grace)

- (a) You have power available in you, the same power that raised Christ from the grave.
- (b) With that power anything is possible, as long as it is the will of God.

G. Know Your Destiny

- (1) What is your role?
 - (a) You are called to be an exact representative of God in the earth. You are an ambassador, as if everything God is doing in the earth is happening through you.

H. Know Your Authority

- (1) What is your position?
 - (a) Christ has all the authority in the universe, and He passed it on to you like a runner in a relay race passes on a baton. You are charged with faithfully carrying that authority.
 - (b) Satan is active in the earth, but you have been given complete authority over him and all his activities.

Summary: FORCE ("TAKE IT BY FORCE") ACTION

3. Mostly peaceful protests (Strategic Weapons)

A. <u>Prayer</u>

(1) What do you say? What language do you speak? What language does the Spirit speak?

- (a) Everything in prayer, all requests come before God. Do this and you will have a life of peace
- (b) Confess your sins and be repentant; pray for others;Prayer should be fervent!
- (c) If you don't know what to pray, the Holy Spirit will intercede for you. God knows everything that is on your heart and what you need.
- (d) Prayer must be according to God's will only!
- (e) Pray nonstop, in your mind, at all times measuring things against God's will. Rejoice and give thanks constantly.

B. Fasting

- (1) What will you surrender? What will you not return to?
 - (a) Fasting means abstinence. Whatever you are abstaining from you are fasting from. Fasting from the basic needs of life like food is a powerful mechanism used to "crucify your flesh." Sometimes the only way to win a spiritual battle is to engage in this type of dominion over your own flesh.
 - (b) Both Moses and Jesus fasted for 40 days. Supernaturally, Moses fasted without food or water.
 - (c) Esther's fast was a life and death matter. I recommend you read the entire book of Esther. Esther needed to

approach the king without an invitation, which usually was a death sentence. She fasted, and invited others to join her, so she would find favor with the king. She needed him to be aware that he had inadvertently ordered a death sentence for her people, and that he must reverse it!

(d) Don't ever go back to what you surrendered!

C. <u>Faith</u>

- (1) What do you believe? What will you practice believing?What are your testimonies?
 - (a) Without faith it is impossible to please God. And yet, you must have faith in something you not see. You might say that faith is the opposite of sight.
 - (b) The evidence of things not seen. We are challenged with many problems for which we cannot see a solution. And yet we are called to have faith and confess our faith. We don't lose heart! How? We simply should not gain confidence from the things we can see, because they are temporary. Instead, we focus on the things we cannot see—faith!
 - (c) Faith is inextricably connected to obedience.
 - (d) A faithless generation thinks there is no answer. But, all things are possible to those who believe, and if you are

struggling to believe there is a simple prayer, "Lord I believe, help my unbelief!"

- (e) The Faith muscle
 - When you have to exercise your faith, you build your faith muscle. Living in faith builds testimonies. If you tell your testimonies God will give you more testimonies to tell.

D. <u>Obedience</u>

- (1) How will you act? What do do? What will you not do?
 - (a) If you love God you will obey God! Obedience is the action side of faith. If you obey God's word, then His love is perfected in you.
 - (b) You are a slave to that which you obey. You are either a slave to sin or a slave to righteousness.

E. <u>Service</u>

- (1) How will you serve? Who will you serve? What is your commission?
 - (a) At his last meal before He was betrayed and crucified,
 Y'shua washed His disciples feet. He did this as an act
 of service and to serve as an example of how we should
 serve one another. He did this at the most excruciating
 time of His life, knowing what was coming. If our

Master would do such for us, how then ought we serve one another?

(b) Even the king of the universe did not come to be served, but to be a servant. We are not to rule like pagans, who want to be catered to. Instead, those who desire to be great in the kingdom become servants. And the greatest servants act as slaves for the kingdom.

F. <u>Sacrifice</u>

- (1) How much will you give up?
 - (a) What would you give up to be a disciple? The scriptures say you have to be willing to surrender everything, including your own life. To die is gain!
 - (b) You have to be willing to sacrifice everything. Anything you are not willing to let go of will prevent you from following Him!

G. Meekness

- (1) How will you moderate your power and exercise authority? Will you recognize the timing?
 - (a) If you enemy slaps you, turn your cheek; if he needs stole you jacket, simply assume he needed it more that you!
 - (b) At the moment of His betrayal, Y'shua had the ability to defend Himself and to destroy anyone coming against

Him. But instead, He stood in submission to the call of His Father on His life. He freely and willingly surrendered His life, even though He had absolute power to destroy His enemies absolutely. He chose not to exercise His power because it was not the proper time and it was better for us that He go to the cross! (See: <u>Fire, Worms & Warring Angels</u>)

H. Love

- (1) Who will you emulate?
 - (a) The greatest of all weapons is love. Love has the power to cover anything. And without it, the others simply don't matter!
 - (b) Love is both infinitely complex and simple. God is love. When we know Christ and live in Christ, God's love is manifested in us, and we can then truly love one another. How is God's love manifested perfectly? It was manifested by His sacrifice, sending His son to die in our place. That is the perfect manifestation of love and is precisely how we should treat one another. There is no greater love than to sacrifice your life for another.

I. BONUS: Praise & Worship

(1) When you are surrounded by enemies and there is no conceivable way to victory... (See: II Chronicles 20:1-29)

(a) You will NOT need to fight; stand still (just as Moses said at the Red Sea crises in Exodus 14:13)—sing and praise! And your enemies will be defeated!

J. Final Thoughts

- (1) The weapons of our warfare...
 - (a) It is high calling. As ambassadors, we are called to punish disobedience. But, only when we have become obedient. Our fight to reach this destinations is not in the flesh, but in the Spirit. Therefore, the weapons we use to win that warfare it's not in the flesh, but in the Spirit. We must exercise Spiritual Violence and Spiritual Force.
- (2) Daily Practice for home...
 - (a) Put on the Whole Armor of God!
